As you may be aware, there are fifteen seats on the parish council. We have not been up to full strength for some time now, which puts a strain on existing councillors to complete all the work necessary for the smooth running of our parish. I encourage all residents to consider joining us. Just a few hours a month is all that is required to make a significant contribution to village life. A number of councillors are stepping down this year, so the need is greater than ever for new members. As you read this report, you will see how much the parish council does for the village. I would like to thank David for all his work on the Community Care Committee and Ian for his terrific efforts on behalf of youth work in the village. We welcomed two new councillors, Milton residents David Stirrups and Adam Dark. Unfortunately, Adam has had to step down due to study commitments.

ANNUAL PRECEPT

Although your parish council increased the precept to £129,000 for 2015-16, our tax base has increased over the past year, so this actually represents a *decrease* for a band D property in Milton. We trust that this will help residents and families in the current economic climate.

FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

I would like to thank councillor Hazel Smith, who chairs the Finance & Administration Committee, for all her work during the past year. This committee, in addition to making a recommendation for the annual village precept level, is responsible for overseeing all the finances for the parish in its day-to-day running. Hazel has spent a considerable amount of time on this work and her efforts are greatly appreciated.

HELPING TO KEEP OUR VILLAGE CLEAN



The Milton Environmental Group again conducted regular litter picks throughout the year to ensure that our village looks its best. We are also very grateful to Parish and District Councillors Hazel Smith and Anna Bradnam for their work to clean up the verges on the southern approach to the village. Hazel also continues dialogue with the Tesco store manager to deal with

litter and other issues that come up through the year.

MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE

I would like to thank councillor Gary Heaney who chairs the Maintenance Committee as well as all the committee members for their work during the past year on behalf of the village. This committee oversees the grass-cutting and tree work for the entire village as well as maintaining all the various play areas, in addition to the allotments and the village cemetery. They certainly have had their work cut out for them this year, and we are very grateful for all their time and effort.

COMMUNITY CARE

Our Community Care warden Tracey Ebbon continues to do fantastic work with elderly residents in the village who want to maintain their independence and live in their own homes. I would like to thank Tracey as well as the Community Care Committee for all their work on behalf of our elders in the village. This year, our Community Care Scheme, which is one of the largest in the county, received grants from Milton Charities and South Cambs District Council.

YOUTH

The parish council continues to provide financial support to the youth club, and Milton Action for Youth (MA4Y) helps oversee youth work in the village. Thanks to parish councillor lan Tyes and MA4Y for their valuable work with the youth of the parish.



PLANNING

I would like to thank parish councillor Rob Farrington and the Planning Committee for all their work during the previous year. This committee reviews all the planning applications for the village and provides comments to South Cambs District Council, which makes the final determination. Rob studies all the plans and visits the sites to determine what effect the proposals may have on adjacent properties. The committee also notes any concerns from neighbours.

Your parish council has been working over many years with various developers of this site to get the best for the village in the legal agreements. The legal agreements cover various items and include a sum for public art. Your council are considering what to spend this on, as a wide range of options could be considered public art. We are also awaiting the handing over of the new pavilion and sports area, which will have two football pitches. A large part of the open space, the new play area and the Repton Lake will remain the responsibility of a management company and will not be passed on to the parish council.
