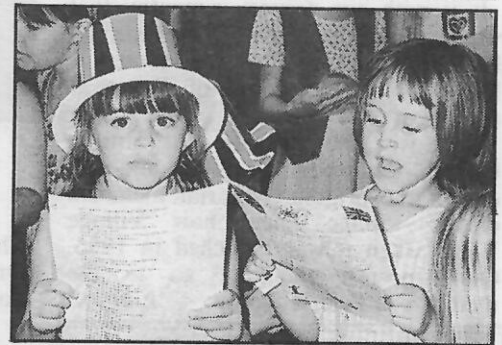

50th Anniversary Of VE Day

On the morning of the 8th May a large crowd of people gathered together in Milton Country Park to Commemorate the 50th Anniversary of V.E. Day, and to take part in a memorial service, which started outside the Information Centre with an Inspection of Standards by the Lord Lieutenant James G.P.Crowden, K.St.J.,J.P. and Major General Crookenden.

Then a parade of Sea Cadets, A.T.C. Cadets, Army Cadets and Scouts, followed by members of the British Legion, other Ex-Service Associations and Parachute Regiment proceeded to Remembrance Meadow.

The V.I.P party led by E.D. Wilson, Esq. O.B.E., The president of the Country Branch of the Royal British Legion, approached the memorial stone as the Band played Onward Christian Soldiers.

An address was made by Chairman of the District Council, Councillor Christopher Tulitt and the memorial stone was unveiled by Lord Lieutenant James G.P. Crowden. A blessing of the memorial was made by the Right Reverend Lord Bishop of Ely, Stephen Sykes.

After the Last Post, the President of the County Branch of the Royal British Legion laid a wreath and the Exhortation was said. We all stood very still while the Reveille was sounded, then all joined in to sing the National Anthem. A final blessing was made by the Bishop of Ely. The V.I.P. party then moved to the Saluting Base as the Band played the Supreme Sacrifice. To many, like me, who remember the V.E. Day of 1945 very clearly, it brought back many memories of those war days and the relief we felt when it was finally all over. As I looked around at the many young families who came to the Country Park to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of V.E. Day, I hoped and prayed that they would be able to continue to live in peace.

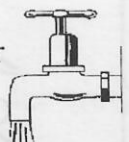

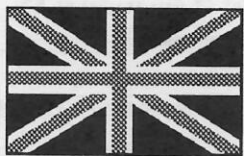

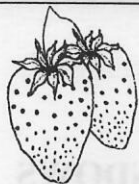

A lot of us at this time are being asked what we remember of VE Day and although I have a very good memory I really cannot remember much about the end of the war. I did go into a neighbour's house for a celebratory drink of whisky and she said I was not capable of walking a straight line - she was exaggerating of course, but that was due to my condition at the time. I was married during the war and had an iced cake made by a friend who used her own rations because I was not allowed any from where I worked. All wedding gear and bridesmaids dresses were borrowed, the only new thing was the headdress which I still have. No wedding present lists in those days, instead of microwaves, suites, freezers, vacuums etc. etc. insert two glass jugs about two shillings each, two tablespoons, two dusters, and a table runner. One big present was a pair of sheets and a cheque for £10. Ah, well, it probably didn't do me any harm. MGD

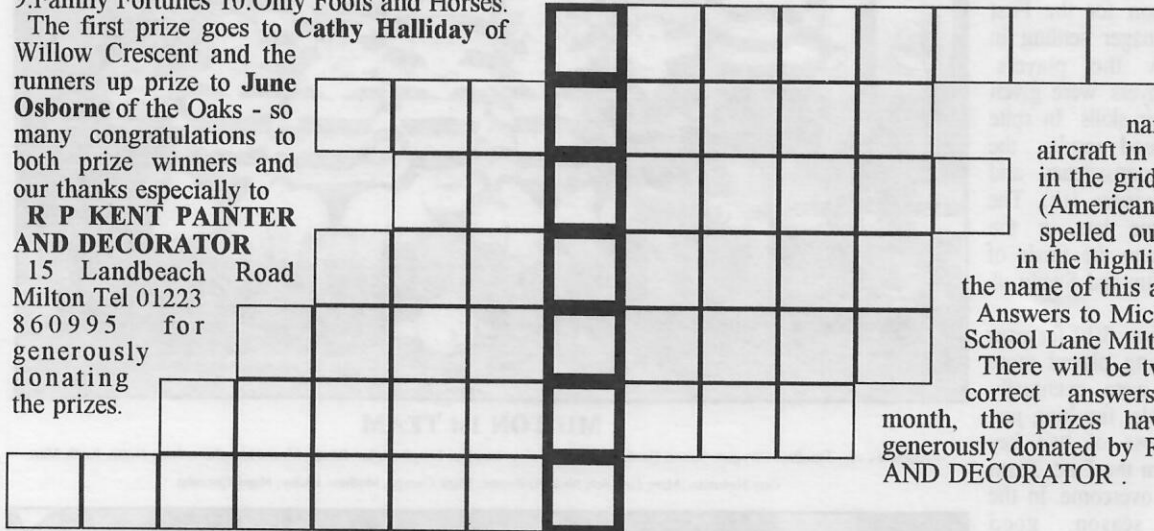
