
Ken Green pictured above takes up his new position as a caretaker at the Community Centre. Ken's association with the centre and the old Village Hall goes back 25 years.



Milton Warden Scheme

It is now 18 months since the warden scheme commenced and we are now, I hope, an integral part of the care the elderly of Milton can and do receive. We have 12 members, each of whom pays £1 a week, and receives in return a service that has variously been described to me as similar to that provided by the AA and very good value for money! If I cannot do a job or solve a problem I usually know a man (or woman) who can! My tasks have been many and varied, ranging from skinning a fillet of sole to helping a member find suitable residential care and supporting her through the difficult weeks up to her move. Collecting pensions, light shopping, liaising with Social Services, the local surgery, hospital departments, organising repairs of clocks, glasses, false teeth ... the list is endless. However, perhaps most important of all is the time spent simply talking, sharing memories and the occasional cup of coffee.

Several of the members also receive help from Social Services in the guise of visits from Home Care Assistants. In these instances we work together, they provide the personal care and practical daily help and I have more time to spend talking and listening. The village is very lucky to have a group of dedicated HCA among them Christine Parson, and between us we hope to enable those who wish to remain in their own homes, to do so with dignity

and care. I would like to take this opportunity to thank for their support - the Parish Council and the Community Centre Committee, and the many people who respond when I ring up and say "I have a bit of a problem". Most importantly I would like to thank all the members of the scheme for allowing me to enter their homes and be part of their lives.



The Other Milton Based Football Club

At the beginning of the 1950's a new Football Club was formed in Milton - its name being ROOKES SPORTS. Rookes was a building firm with headquarters in Cambridge owned by George Russell whose family connection with Milton spanned several generations, and at that time lived at Holly Dene in Butt Lane.

A number of enthusiastic Milton footballers found it difficult to gain a place in the Milton F.C. teams. George Russell agreed to sponsor this group, several in the group being tradesman employed by George in his building firm.

This sponsorship contributed to transport costs and supplying equipment, mostly made from materials allied to the building trade. Meetings and Club nights were usually held in the black garage at the front of Holly Dene, but in severe weather conditions the hospitality of the Lion and Lamb was most welcome.

Local farmer Mr Harold Easy willingly made a meadow available, and occasionally when Harold's herd of Friesians strayed onto the pitch, cow-pat clearance was hastily carried out before the kick-off. This was quickly accomplished as all the players "mucked in" with this task. The Tesco shopping complex now occupies this site.

Familiar local names including HALL, HAIRD, NORMAN, COX, TYRRELL, BROWN, HODGE, GREENACRE, FROMENT, SMITH AND THE SHIPPS, formed the nucleus of this club. At times when the three Shipps played in the team a nautical theme was prominent, William the elder, a good anchor man at the back and twins Ron and Don sailing through opposing defences creating utter confusion, not only with their footballing skills, but also with their almost identical appearances.

The team gained respect with every game played in the Histon and District League, winning the league in the 1952/53

season.
