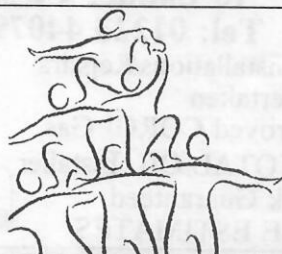

We look forward to welcoming all our patients to the new surgery which will open on 1st April - no, it wasn't an April Fool!

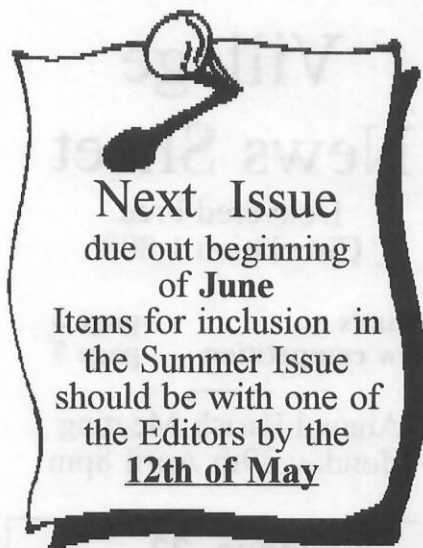


Dr. Steward & Dr. Hunt outside the new Surgery

1996 County Floor and Vault Competition

TWELVE children from Milton took part in the 1996 Cambridgeshire County Floor and Vault Gymnastic Competition at the Bushfield Sports Centre, Peterborough on Saturday 16th March.

All the children are coached by Mr Ian Arnott and attend (or have attended) the Milton Primary School Gym Club. In addition they are all members of the South Cambridgeshire Schools Gymnastic Display Team (S.C.S.G.D.T) based at Cottenham Village College and this is where they do the majority of their training.

All the children performed extremely well and for some, it was their first gymnastics competition. Several of the children won certificates and medals.

Sophie Pullen came 1st on the vault and 3rd on the floor giving her the Gold Medal in the under 9 Girls competition.

Her sister Katie Pullen came 2nd on the floor and 4th on the vault giving her the Bronze Medal in the Under 11 Girls competition.

Mathew Still came 2nd on both the floor and the vault and took the Silver Medal in the under 11 boys competition.

Sarah Lester came 3rd on the vault and 4th overall in the Under 13 Girls Competition.

Adrian Van Leeuwen came 4th on the vault in the Under 11 Boys Competition.

Mr Arnott had a very successful day entering 36

gymnasts from his S.C.S.G.D.T. against all the other clubs in the county. His team is made up from other local school children and together they managed to take 41 of the top four placings in all the age groups with no less than 5 Age Group Champions. Well done to all the children and their Coach!!!

THE TROUBLE WITH DOGS..... ✨ ✨ ✨ ✨ ✨

When I last wrote on this topic a year ago (VV No. 16), South Cambridgeshire District Council seemed to be about to bring in the "poop-scoop" bye-law, but so far have failed to do so. What are they waiting for?

Milton Parish Council has been looking into how Gt Shelford dealt with the problem, when their recreation ground became too popular with dog walkers and heavily fouled in consequence. They formed a Dog Owners' Association to promote good practice when on the recreation ground and charged a modest sub to print membership leaflets and leaflets about worming.

To be effective they found they need about 50 members and require regular recruitment drives to maintain this number. The association has effected a good improvement.

Does Milton have a problem with dog fouling? I think we do. The number of dogs in the village has more than doubled in recent years and there is a fouling problem in the village generally, on the Sycamores recreation ground and, sadly, on the play areas despite the signs. This shows that it is Milton dog owners rather than visitors who are failing to clear up after their animals. In the winter months, it is more obvious - people take shorter walks, often in the dark, and wet conditions make things worse.

To provide special bins around the village and have them emptied would cost £1,000-£2,000 a year, and, although convenient, they are not essential. A sunken bucket, perforated and with a lid, could be provided quite cheaply for the recreation ground; this would then be purified with a chemical solution. Such a device has been used successfully in Fulbourn.

The aims of a Dog Owners' Association would be threefold:

1. To keep all parts of the village clear of dog faeces
2. To spread the message about good health practice and regular worming of dogs and cats
3. To enjoy our dogs without letting them be an offence to others

It would mean work and effort to form, and sustain a Dog Owners' Association. Do we need such a thing? And how about a special badge which the dogs could wear? Please let us know your views on the slip below. (By the way, I do have OTHER interests in my life!) Jo Snaith
