(Part of The Compass Trust)



Seven Years Ago

Do you remember the problems with the school bus: when it arrived late, or failed to arrive, and the parents who organised it had to keep badgering the bus company to keep it going? If there were more children wanting to go by bus than there were places, and if a bigger bus couldn't be found, it was "first come, first served " and the rest had to cycle or persuade parents to drive them to school. Children signed up for a term at a time, and from one term to the next no one had any security.


You could never rely on it being on time and children were known to have been late

for exams.

One Friday before half-term, with no warning, the bus driver handed all the children a slip to say they would have to make other arrangements for the rest of the term: parents had to try to get another bus at really short notice.

Then in 1992 Jane Coston took a case to the Education Appeals Panel to prove that Butt Lane was too dangerous to expect children to walk along to school, and since then we have had a bus place for every 11-15 year old who wanted it. As the road gets more and more busy, let's hope this bus will continue in the future, for all our children's safety. We risk losing it if the proposed cycle way is built.

# Lollipop Lady is a Black Belt

In 1988 at the age of 38 Jane Daniels attended 6 sessions of Ladies Self Defence run by Mr JG Keerie and at the end of the course she was invited to join the local karate class.

She first attended the local class in January 1989 with a friend and they were the only ladies present but were made to feel very welcome. Jane had thought she was quite a fit person but she soon found out different. Although she had been to aerobics and keep fit classes these exercises required stamina and flexibility both of which she felt she was lacking. The one step techniques and forms again she found impossible at first but after a few months they began to make some sense and she enjoyed the patterns.

It was nearly two years before Mr Keerie managed to persuade her to grade as she felt that this was only for youngsters and fit young men not middle aged ladies. However she did grade. It was at this point she decided to read through the manual. She had gained some terminology through class and found the history of the formation of Tang Soo Do interesting. The Five Codes, Seven Tenets and Fourteen Attitudes were sound principles she could relate to - so what was this Tang Soo Do. It wasn't just a physically age was against her, she could relate to the purpose of Tang Soo Do training

of Tang Soo Do training.

After the first grading she felt a sense of achievement. Learning one step techniques and hyungs was physically and mentally stimulating and she also felt self defence techniques may come in useful one day. The group is lead by an instructor with strong personality who is totally fair showing no favouritism who will tolerate no bad behaviour

and only complete obedience.

Tang Šoo Do is now part of Jane's life (and her family's). It has made her more confident in all aspects of life.
