Local Council Elections

Have you ever wanted to get more involved in the village? Would you like to have some influence on things like planning applications, cycle schemes, care of the elderly, support for youth groups, planting of trees and flowers around the village and a myriad of other decisions that need to be made in order to keep Milton a pleasant place to live?

Well, now's your chance as there will be local council elections on 6th May 1999 to elect a new Parish Council (15 councillors). If you've ever considered becoming a parish councillor you should be thinking about doing so now as this is likely to be your only chance in the next four years.

Ideally we need a broad spectrum of people on the council so that they're representative of the village as a whole so don't say to yourself you're not the sort of person the council needs.

Many thanks to John Coston for refereeing and Peter Welton and Alan Messett for organising this event.



The Friends of Milton Country Park.

If you thought that Milton was wet this winter, you should have braved the New Year Walk that the 'Friends' undertook on the 9th of January. There was a frost overnight and the forecast for the day was cold and sunny, perhaps some cloud and possibly wintry showers!! The 'Friends' met at noon and drove over to Wicken Fen. There were only a few cars in the car park but it did seem like quite a pleasant afternoon. We had a look round the Visitor Centre, checked the 'recent sightings' board and then ate sandwiches and had a hot drink before setting out along the 'Adventurers' path. The path was fairly wet, muddy in places but we sauntered along admiring the fen countryside and noting the birdlife. The sun was out most of the time but once or twice the clouds did threaten rain. Having walked about a mile into the fen we turned right to cross towards the lode in order to return to the car park. Looking through binoculars, the track did look wet in places but we agreed that once over the two worst stretches, it would 'be alright' from there. The two worst stretches were bad. Heavy trucks had turned the already wet land into nothing short of a quagmire - nearly a foot deep in places - squelchy muddy clay. We all got through and as the sun started to set behind us we finished the walk and I am pleased to say that everyone made it back to the car park. A very pleasant January walk, with some 39 species of birds seen on the way round. These included a flock of golden plover which obliged by flying directly overhead and a number of cormorant sitting in trees looking like last years Christmas decorations. We had no rain during the afternoon, but it was certainly wet under foot.

The AGM of the 'Friends' is to be held on the afternoon of 26th March. Why not join us? Our intention is to have several more walks this year looking at all types of wildlife and there are ongoing projects in the Park that need help. I know there are all sorts of other things to do these days, but the Park is on your doorstep - step inside and you could be miles from anywhere and enjoying the countryside.

Allotment Coppice Project Dear Allotment Holders.

Thank you for your excellent response to my letter about growing hazel and willow for coppicing at the allotment site. 15 replies out of 40 is very encouraging. 14 were in favour and I against; of those in favour 8 were prepared to offer practical help. On this basis I think we can proceed to the next stage, which is to look at the work and costs involved and

explore what support may be available.

I mentioned the idea to David Rees, of the County Council Rural Group, recently and he responded with enthusiasm. There is a coppice at the Milton agricultural college that was planted 15 years ago; it has been producing poles for a while and now larger timber is being cut but the variety of trees planted there is greater than the two proposed for the allotments.

At this stage I envisage that voluntary help will be needed for planting, but not ground preparation, and for weed control. I anticipate 3 successive plantings of 15-20 small plants over 3 years. After 5 years the first planting may be ready for coppicing. If the scheme looks workable we should be able to start planting next winter. Look out for more news in the next issue of the Village View.

Millennium Boundary Walk

The Milton Millennium festival year is promising to be quite a memorable event with all kinds of permanent memorials as well as some exciting one-off events.

A one-off novelty event - a series of circular walks which will, as nearly as possible, beat the nine miles of the Milton parish bounds - is just one of the exciting activities planned for the village's millennium celebrations.

Originally, veteran walker David Waterson wanted a continuous boundary similar to the circuit he recently did with parish council chairman Bob Waters.

However, this seems nigh on impossible with large parties (limited to 20 at a time) which it is hoped will turn up.

While the north-south boundaries are straightforward, enough by the Mere Way and the river, the east-west links pose difficulties in crossing the railway and motorway which are impractical and positively dangerous with parties.

So now the proposal is to organise three or four shorter walks of three to five miles in length, stopping for picnics or a convenient pub.

We need *every* sort of person! Indeed the current parish council consists of six women and nine men and they have a broad spread of ages from mid-thirties upwards with a wide variety of backgrounds and occupations. The only limitation is a legal one, which is that you must be over 21 and you must have some connection with the village, for example you live or work in the village.

You don't have to be a member of a political party, nor do you have to say if you are. You don't need to actively campaign unless you want to. To help your campaign we will give you the opportunity to write a short election address to be included in the April edition just before the election, and you can also have an

election address, and a picture if you have one, put up on the village Web site. If you get elected then your minimum commitment is to attend full council which is held on the first Monday of each month (except August) at 7pm in the Community Centre on Coles Road but most councillors also get involved in other committees and activities so a more realistic commitment is probably two evenings a month, plus some reading in between times and the odd phone call.

PS: there is also an election for a District councillor for South Cambridgeshire District Council. Being a district councillor is considerably more onerous than being a parish councillor - you will get a lot more documents to read, meetings happen during the day and in Cambridge not in Milton, and you will find you are often approached by villagers with their problems. Our current district councillor (who will be standing again this time) estimates that he is putting in an average of 15 hours a week on council business, and considerably more some weeks. This is not to put you off, but you should be aware that it is a much greater commitment.
