A14 Widening Plans

Consultations are being carried out about various schemes to improve the A14. Part of the proposals show widening of the existing A14 to three lanes in each direction between Fen Drayton and Fen Ditton. The road is proposed to narrow to 2 lanes under Milton interchange and the third lanes will become part of the slip roads at this point. The cycle/footbridge over the A14 was built wide enough to take the extra proposed lanes. The provisional time table for this and other work is as follows.

Field Works near the Cycle Bridge

A new hardcore surface has been laid in the field near the cycle bridge and Tesco as hard standing for the road works cabins and equipment associated with the improvement work on the interchange. The proposal is that the hardcore surface will be removed at the end of the works and the top soil, which has been retained on site, will be reinstated.

As reported in the April Village View, Milton interchange is to undergo extensive reshaping. There will be a new dedicated lane from the Science Park on to the A14 and improvements to some slip roads to allow traffic to flow left without joining the interchange traffic. A new traffic signal system will be installed. Work is due to start in July. Temporary traffic management will be in place during the work.



County Councillor stands down after 12 years

At the Annual Parish Meeting Paul Oldham, speaking on behalf of the village, thanked Jane Coston for her hard work over the last twelve years for the village as County Councillor. He talked about how she had worked hard not just for Milton but for the other villages in her division too: Landbeach, Waterbeach and Chittering and that although one can look at the big things she's been involved with, like the bridge, the sewage works or getting the high street resurfaced it's dealing with individual villagers' problems where she has really made a difference. He

finished by quoting from an email he had received from parish councillor Liz Baker:

I think that a key point of Jane's councillorship is that she took ownership of every problem that was ever brought to her. Even if it wasn't her responsibility she would find out where you needed to go next before dropping contact. For those people who are faced with a featureless mass of local government, Jane has been more important than the results of her work show.

Now Milton has the Black Squirrel

The fence between my garden and Michael Spooner's property has become the 'M1' for grey squirrels journeying between the woodland around the church and Milton Hall and Fen Road, and possibly the Country Park. Although an attractive animal with its acrobatic antics, it is generally considered to be a pest taking the food we put out for the birds, eating their eggs, and in my case not leaving one hazel nut on my trees, what it doesn't eat it buries in the lawn and makes large holes to retrieve them later. Now we have another type of squirrel — a black one seen on the 'Ml' fence and in the vicinity of the church by Michael Spooner and me this spring. Last year it was reported in the Cambridge Weekly News that a family of black squirrels was present in Chesterton, they have also been seen at Girton.

The grey squirrel was introduced into lowland Britain from North America in the 19th century and the black variant of the grey (melanic form) was first seen at Woburn Park, Bedfordshire. The black squirrel has spread to Buckinghamshire and Hertfordshire with a notable population in Letchworth, and then to Cambridgeshire. The black colour is strongly inherited and in stable grey squirrel populations the ratio of greys to black can be 4:1, whereas the white albino form is rare and can be seen in Kent and East Sussex. How large is Milton's population of black squirrels? To find out we need to keep our eyes open and report any sightings (date and place) to Malcolm Busby (Tel. 01223 420060). Incidently, Malcolm informs me that any black squirrels in the Country Park have not yet been reported to him. This is a great opportunity for children to contribute to a new natural history project in the village, 'Black Squirrel Watch'. I hope the black beast is not more destructive than its grey Derek Booth cousin!

Often winter evenings were spent rehearsing for Concerts that would take place at a number of venues outside the village, usually in aid of our new Sunday School Hall Funds. We needed £700 to meet the cost of our project and with an income of about £7 per concert this was obviously going to take some time to achieve. At the Church Guide and Scout Groups became active. In winter us boys played football and in summer, cricket. remember one summer, the Headmaster of the village school, a Mr Faulkner, had somehow come upon a Silver Cup and decided to organise a knockout competition between the lads of Waterbeach, Landbeach and Milton. At the 'toss up' Milton won a bye to meet the winners of Landbeach/Waterbeach game. The game was played at Landbeach so with Waterbeach the winners over the home side, both participants in the final game were fairly disadvantaged by the already defeated, hostile, home side and its supporters. What was that you said...oh, who won? I wasn't going to mention that, but as you asked....Steve Lucas opened the bowling one end, I the other. reached a respectable score of 13 runs before losing their final wicket. change in bowlers was deemed necessary. The opening batsman for Milton, well who else, Steve at one end and I at the other. Feeling somewhat chivalrous, we decided to declare when our partnership had managed to score two more runs than our opponents. The Cup was never played for again and the last time I saw it, it was in the old Milton School and I often wonder what happened to it and whether it may now be housed in the new School and perhaps used for some event in the School's activities of

Doggy Matters

The Community Centre Committee has been wondering what to do to try to stop the dog mess that turns up on both our recreation grounds, and means that some poor soul has to inspect the pitches and clear it all up before football and cricket matches.

New signs will be going up on the recreation grounds, and if necessary the dog warden can be called in. Dogs will be allowed on the edges of the recreation grounds but their owners must keep them off the pitches.

Any dog mess should of course be cleared up by the owner and there is a fine of up to £1000 for failing to do this.

The same problems have occurred in the Country Park. Dog mess should always be cleaned up, even in the wooded area at the North end of the park, where dogs are allowed off their leads.

Our equipment was very sparse, rickety trestle tables, one shop soiled cooker, one heated cupboard acquired from the Farm School which is still in use and working very well. By this time it had become necessary to increase the cost of the lunch to 50p, and it has gone up in stages until now when the cost is £2.30. This price enables us to have a free Xmas dinner, and extras on special birthday lunches.

From the beginning Kate Edwards and Dolly Smith organised a raffle at the Church Fete and Xmas bazaar for the Lunch Club, until they felt it was getting too much for them. The special birthday lunches came into fruition in February 1991 when a member reached the age of 90 years. She felt she wanted to celebrate having reached that age, and insisted on paying for it, so her family and friends attended, and it was a happy occasion. We now celebrate 70, 80, 90 and now 100 years, in fact some are coming up to their second round.

These lunches are very hard work, with lots of preparation beforehand, but the pleasure we get out of them is very rewarding. We are fortunate in having a number of ladies making desserts for us: they are called affectionately "Pudden Wimmin". Some of the members also contribute towards this, although we try to limit it to once or twice a year. There were twenty but some have moved away, and others felt they were unable to carry on. There are several ladies we call on to help at special occasions and to make people feel they are lunching at Buckingham Palace or the Ritz we have a band of waiters. The Christmas lunch is quite special as all helpers are invited; everybody gets a small present which is more for fun than monetary value. Seventy plus people attend with the atmosphere being half the enjoyment.

Irene Bell who was now on her own made up a team of five. We now have Daphne, Maria, Viv, Margery, Betty, and Rene, which enables us to have cover for absentees.
