New Milton Park & Ride Archaeology Excavations

The open day was a great success with large numbers of people visiting the site.

The excavations have revealed a densely occupied late Iron Age settlement along the northern boundary of the site, with much of the settlement extending north under Butt Lane.

Once the New Park and Ride is completed it is proposed that there should be some permanent displays so people using the site will be able to discover the past history of the site.

More Traffic Jams? Guided Bus - Roadworks

As part of the Guided Busway project, construction work near Cambridge Regional College (off King's Hedges Road) is to be started shortly.

The contractor needs to build a new junction for the Guided Busway. This will require temporary road works to be put in place on King's Hedges Road and the road into CRC. Vehicular access will be maintained at all times but it is likely there will be some inconvenience for drivers. The road works will be put in place on Monday 8th October and are expected to continue until February 2008. Also work is expected to start at the Milton Road junction in January and last for 27 weeks.

New local Charity

Reopens manufacturing site in village

Paving slabs and other concrete products will soon be available again in Milton. The Phoenix Trust (Milton) Ltd a registered Charity, together with its sister company Phoenix Associates (Milton) Ltd have reopened a former site on the Industrial Estate with limited production planned to commence in October leading to increased output by next spring. The company who's main objective is to advance the education of disadvantaged young people and adults with special needs by providing sheltered work experience, training and opportunities to achieve qualifications, have had a long hard struggle to reopen the site.

Barry Jefferson, Chairman and Managing Director said "It's taken 10 months to get to where we are now with many ups and downs but we never gave up hope we could achieve our aim. We even put some of our own assets in before we knew whether the site had been finally secured."

Kate Geeson, Director, and head of Training added, "to get some of the former lads back on site will be wonderful, they

have been unemployed since the previous company stopped trading in May of last year, it has been with them in mind that has been our driving force and our determination to reopen. All new students will have the opportunity to be trained in the N.P.T.C. Course in Construction and Retail. The range of products will be increased over the next few months and it is hoped to include fencing, some garden ornamentation and wooden benches with most being made on site. Several other projects are in the pipeline but it is realised that with limited resources we can only start these when funding is available. Diversification is essential to increase turnover, but it is not expected that any profit will be made for at least three years. To break even after this time is an aim, but like many Social Firms reliance on grants and funding is a must. Much support has already been given by Dickerson's, Cambridge Mencap, Business Enterprise, Business in the Community, Travis Perkins, G Cartwright, N V Brown, CamFIRE, and the Pye Foundation.

From early October onwards it is planned for the site to be open at least two days a week, Tuesdays and Thursdays, increasing to four days by spring 2008. A limited range of slabs and other products will be available initially building to a more comprehensive range and greatly increased stocks through the winter months ready for next spring."

Special thanks from the Directors, who are particularly grateful for the enormous support and help given by the Stokes family who own the site.



Milton Country Park

South Cambridgeshire District Councillors have decided to hand over Milton Country Park to Cambridge Sport Lakes Trust on a 99-year lease.

The park had been under threat of closure since December 2006.

The council are planning for the transfer to take place by early next year.

Under the trust's plans, the park would continue to provide existing amenities and expand on activities available for visitors.

The District Council will give a one-off £250,000 payment to the trust, which proposes to take on the park's existing staff.

Cambridge Sport Lakes Trust is raising funds for its multi-sport park featuring international standard competition lakes, for rowing, canoeing, and triathlon, which will be next to the Park and the District Council Planning Committee agreed 'delegated approval' for the sport lakes at their meeting in February this year subject to a number of matters being resolved.

Children and staff at Milton Hospice were there to greet a special enormous birthday card as it stopped off during a nationwide tour organised by the Association of Children's Hospices.



Celebrating 25 years of children's hospice care in the UK, the card is being sent to many different children's hospices, and it came to Milton in July. Children enjoyed using a special giant pencil to sign and write their messages. The inside of the card is filled with lively artwork by the children from the different hospices, as well as birthday greetings and thanks for all the work of ACH.

The artwork and fun associated with the card's call at Milton reflect the philosophy of making the most of every minute which is at the heart of children's hospice care.

Campbells in Uganda

We did it!

Here is the house we built in Uganda in the summer. I know it has no roof but our part was to build the walls and the roof will be done by experts!

We had a group of Ugandan builders with us who said we did just fine.

It was a tremendous experience for all of us. We will never forget the sights of poverty, the faces of

the children from the choir who came to Cambridge as they greeted us, the smells, the laughter and the tears.

We spent two weeks building, visiting a church of 14,000 complete with a choir of 80! The loud, joyful singing was awesome!

We visited the babies home in Kampala and presented them with the gifts bought with the money raised at Milton school sponsored walk. They were so grateful. It was sad to leave the babies behind but good to know they were being cared for and no longer abandoned.

We visited a home of one of the 'mamas' who look after 8 children in a family unit. They treated us like royalty. The small gifts we brought were so appreciated. The 'mamas' work so hard but they are well cared for by the charity. All food, medical supplies and clothes are provided.

The children are raised with the expectation to be the next Ugandan leaders and are schooled to lead the nation out of corruption.

Presently there are 1500 children housed by Watoto but their plan is 10,000. 50.1% of the nation are under 14 years of age so the need is great.

Other African nations are now learning how to help their country through Watoto's model. While we were there we got the opportunity to go on a safari - I loved the hippos and giraffes the best! Paara Lodge was sheer luxury in comparison to where we were staying even though it took 10 hours to get there on very bumpy roads!

We would love to return one day but in the mean time we will continue to support the children in Uganda and particularly Watoto childcare ministries. It was a humbling experience. We have so much here in the west and we take so much for granted. I hope and pray the lessons learnt will last us a life time!

Planning

A number of residents were at the September meeting to raise

concern over an application made for Silver Acre, High Street - conversion of house to 3 two bedroom flats and 6 one bedroom flats; extension - single storey - two one bedroom flats.

Council decided to recommend refusal to South Cambs. and included a list of comments on the application.

Also received for information only, a copy of an application for a certificate of lawfulness for installation of mezzanine floor at Tesco Store, Cambridge Road.

Bus Shelter

The Bus shelter in Landbeach Road was damaged and councillors agreed repairs. Council also discussed enlarging the hard standing area and replacing the damaged bin once this work was complete.

Highway matters

A number of issues were reported to County Council Highways for action including damaged bollards and poor patching of the road in Hall End.

Mereham

Mereham, a proposed 5,000 home development between Stretham and Wilburton, is being opposed by East Cambridgeshire District Council and Cambridgeshire County Council at the Planning Inspectorate Inquiry at the Arkenstall Centre in Haddenham starting on the 9th October.

The proposal includes, as part of their transport strategy, plans for alterations to Milton High Street and rebuilding the Jane Coston Bridge to make a bus bridge. They are also suggesting widening the A10 but keeping it as a single carriageway and there is concern that this has the potential to create accident blackspots on an already congested route.

Milton Parish Council sent in their objections some time ago and they will be represented at the enquiry.



Milton Day Centre
It is now 14 years since the Day Centre began in the Community Centre, started by a group of volunteers which included Jim Fisher and Margaret Sandford. Things were very different then when every Friday all the comfortable chairs, tables and cooking equipment had to be unpacked from the store room and garage, then they had to be set out in the hall. At the end of the day it all had to be packed up and put away again. All our members lived in the village and were transported by mini-bus, courtesy of Edmund House. It seemed like luxury when we moved to Barnabas Court after it opened in 2000. Since then we have enjoyed the comfort of the day room, along with a well equipped modern kitchen, and our own storage facilities. The Community mini-bus is now used to transport members who need it. The criteria for membership of the Day Centre remains unchanged. It is to provide a hot meal and companionship for the elderly and infirm who live in the village of Milton. Half of our members are now resident in Barnabas Court and the other half come from within the village. We meet every Friday during term time. A typical Friday begins with coffee, biscuits and newspapers after arrival and a chance to chat with friends. There is a weekly raffle and sometimes gentle exercises before enjoying a home cooked 2 course lunch. After lunch there are various activities including quizzes, games, musical entertainment, speakers, slide shows and visits by a class of Milton school children. The day finishes with a welcome cup of tea before returning home.

We are very grateful to the dedicated band of volunteers who help things to run smoothly each Friday, working on a rota basis. We are looking to increase our volunteers, so if you have a few hours to spare on a Friday, say once or twice a month, to help the elderly in the Community, then please contact either Margaret Nunn (Chairman) on 860829 or Pauline Waters (Secretary) on 860620, to
