The College Big Build project gets the go-ahead

The College of West Anglia is pleased to announce that South Cambridgeshire District Council has granted planning permission for a new teaching and learning building on its Milton Campus, which offers a range of land-based programmes including agriculture, countryside management, animal care, horticulture, floristry and equine studies.

The new building is the second phase of the £1.5m redevelopment of the Milton Campus and will provide classroom, study, office and catering facilities for up to 200 college students and staff. Work is due to start in April 2008 and expected to be completed by the autumn. The building will feature a number of sustainable elements such as a "green roof", in which sedum growing on the roof helps to keep the building cool, and the use of foliage to provide summer shading. The first phase – the construction of a new farm workshop building - is already underway and is due for completion by the end of 2007.



Parish Council Report

Mereham

The Inquiry is due to close on December 21st and closing submissions will be heard on the

8th January 2008. The Parish Council has been asking questions about how the plans will affect the A10 road, the A10 and A14 bridges and Milton High Street as well as responding to new additional information that has been presented to the inquiry.

Mereham is a proposed new village near Wilburton and Stretham. The developers have drawn up plans that show how they would deal with the extra traffic generated by the new development and how they would improve public transport. It is these plans that include alterations to our local roads and bridges.

Land adjacent A14

The County Council instructed Balfour Beatty to clear the site of all the remaining material that was left over from the Milton roundabout project and to restore the land to agricultural use. The work has been carried out to the satisfaction of CCC and all that remains is for the site to be seeded with grass.

Congestion Charge

The County Council plan to hold a workshop for Parish Councils in January/February.

Football Ground and Sports Facilities

Churchmanor Estates have sent a letter to South Cambridgeshire District Council about possibly building a community football stadium and other sports facilities on land between A10 and A14. The land presently is Green Belt land which as Green Belt is protected from development.

Urban Renaissance Villages

Urban Renaissance Villages who hope to develop the area near Milton Hall intend to hold another exhibition in the village soon.

Country Park

The Parish Council have arranged a meeting to discus the future management of the nature reserve, Tomkins Mead, with a representative of the Sport Lakes Trust in preparation for when they take over the management of the Country Park.

Budget Planning

Each committee is currently reviewing what budget they need for next year. The Finance & Staffing Committee will then meet in January to plan a budget to recommend to the Council.

Parish Council Minutes of the past 110 years ago!

15th April 1897

It was resolved that the Chairman be empowered to approach the Parish Councils of Landbeach and Cottenham in reference to the construction of a light railway to run from the crossing on Milton Road through Landbeach via Hay Lane to Cottenham.

15th April 1897

A precept was signed upon the overseers for £15. (The Parish Council precept for 2007/8 was £101,000)

Milton Football Club

(From a Football Sufferer)

When I was very young, all I knew about football was that it was round and got kicked about but, when I grew up and got married, I soon found out more

Having a husband and two brothers, from the year 1946 onwards, it was football, football, football. What my life would have been without it I shall never know but it was something I had to get used to.

While my two boys were small, we were in the background but, from the mid 1950's till 1985, it was all about washing shirts, shorts and socks, making tea, etc., etc. After a game one or two players would come in for tea and a bath. When anyone asked where we lived they were told to look for a line of shirts, shorts and socks - that's where they live.

We played on the Electricity Board field till we had to vacate it when another field had to be found. This was in Fen Road loaned to M.F.C. by Harold Easy. It was very bumpy and full of molehills. The changing room was a hut with a lean-to on the side. The tea was made by boiling a kettle of water on the Calor gas and the washing up was done outside. How we managed I shall never know but, as they say "Necessity is the mother of invention" so it had to be done but, having suffered, it makes one appreciate what we have now.

This is only a little bit about M.F.C. and it has only scratched the surface. I could, in fact, write a book about them. We are approaching 61 years and there have only been three secretaries, Fred Burling, Charlie Daniels and now Fraser Confrey who is doing a wonderful job along with Doug Teeboon who has been there as long as I can remember. Charlie was not that fond of a lot of water but he would have jumped in the river for them. He loved the Football Club especially the end of season dinners.

Sometimes I got fed up with it but, looking back, it taught me a lot about people, made lots of friends and it was great fun with all the boys. If it wasn't for the amateur clubs there wouldn't be any professionals.




