From Monday 17th - Thursday 20th March there has been an organised effort to impact on the reduction of crime in the village. This has seen the Primary School run a competition amongst its students to design a crime prevention hanger that could be placed inside a vehicle hanging on the interior mirror to warn potential thieves that there is nothing of value in the vehicle.

This winning design has been mass produced thanks to South Cambs Crime and Disorder Prevention (CDRP) unit funding the production. These hangers have been distributed to every parent at the school and

distributed to every parent at the school and at the 'Roadshow' held on the 20th March at Tesco.

On Monday we held an Environmental Visual Audit (EVA) with partner agencies like the Fire Service, DVLA, South Cambs Environment Agency, Parish Council and the Police to identify areas that could be impacted on to improve the village. The whole village was covered during the walk by all agencies with a number of items around the village removed by the Environment Agency as they had been dumped.

The DVLA parked on the A10 with their Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) system that recorded all the vehicles that passed them. In 3 hours 2300 vehicles passed with 23 of them being driven without any road tax. These offences will be followed up by the DVLA.

Also one foreign vehicle owner has been reported for not registering his vehicle whilst residing

One driver has been reported for driving in the village with no tax.

Eight vehicles were investigated as showing out of date tax but they were off the Highway and declared SORN.



Local residents turned out on a dull afternoon to help litter pick on the western edge of the village. They cleared 10 black sacks of rubbish from the bund north of Butt Lane, and another 10 from the southern bund and around the Sycamores recreation ground. There were also 4 wrecks of bikes, 3 of which came out of the ditch at The Sycamores, and 3 police cones.

One vehicle had to be removed by

Environment Agency.

Several areas in the village have been identified as having graffiti from the EVA and the Probation Service came out on Tuesday to remove it. If you have been a victim of graffiti and you would like it removed please get in contact with the Parish Council as a disclaimer needs to be completed prior to the graffiti being removed. The probation team also carried out a litter pick at the Sycamores Rec. and Fen Road and 40 bags of rubbish were collected.

Also on Tuesday a 'drop in' was held at the Country Park and members of the public had their property such as mobile phones and bikes registered free of charge on www.immobilise.com.

The Fire service has been visiting houses during the week to offer free Fire Safety Checks.

Thursday saw the Roadshow being held at Tesco where members of the Police, DVLA, CDRP, Environment Agency and the County Council Truancy Team were able to provide information to members of the Public. Nine youths were caught playing truant at Tesco. The week has also seen an increase

in the number of Police Officers in both uniform and plain clothes patrolling the village. So far there have been no crimes or reports of anti social behaviour in the village.



At the time of going to press (18/03/08) the team are top of the league with just two matches to play.


