

Proposed Retirement Development

at the site of the Former EDF Depot and Training Centre, Ely Road, Milton Helical (Milton) Ltd together with their development partner, Urban Renaissance Villages, are on the verge of submitting a planning application for a retirement development (over 55) at the above site. As part of the proposals, the existing industrial units will be demolished and the site cleared including the removal of all the pylons within the site to make way for 121 retirement cottages/apartments, predominantly using only the existing built up area of the site.

The developer will also be leasing the eastern part of the site to Milton Parish Council for recreational purposes for use by any organised sports clubs as recognised by the Parish Council and affiliated to Milton Community Centre and Recreation Grounds Management Committee. The developer will also fund and construct a purpose-built pavilion to

Other benefits of the proposals will include the restoration and enhancement of North Lodge, a Grade II listed building; the restoration of the Repton landscape which will include dredging the lake therefore significantly enhancing its ecological value and making this area accessible for walking; and financial contributions towards the improvement of the bus services within Milton.

Upon the granting of planning permission, the developer will only sell to people living within the Cambridge area for the first 3 months and exclusively to the residents of Milton for the first 4 weeks of that period to ensure that local people have the opportunity to purchase the most desirable plots.

Local support for the proposals is important in the consideration of the planning application by South Cambs District Council. The developer will be advising the residents of Milton by way of a leaflet drop that the application has been submitted and would be grateful for every letter of support sent to South Cambs in favour of the planning application.





PPP - Parish Plan Progress

Since Easter we have been working to record and analyse the answers in the 900 returns that we collected – so no surprise that it's taking some time! The fixed response questions have been entered and counted – the open response questions are still being worked on – we are very grateful for the answers and ideas but it does take time to read them all.

The next stage will be to organise a meeting to involve all those who offered to help — or expressed an interest in the different topics covered in the survey. We hope this will happen in the first half of June. The draw for the prizes will take place at the meeting and the winners informed as soon as possible. We will also pass on the contact details of those interested in the different groups or clubs — so look out for information later in June.

We gave a short report at the Annual Parish Meeting with some 'headline' figures. No real surprise that 66% listed the sewage smell as a problem and 63% of drivers say the A14/A10 junction is an issue. 71% want more types of recyclable materials collected and 62% thought a dentist in the village was a good idea.

It is good to note that things are already happening on some of these issues – not always as a response to the survey. The County and District Councillors were given the 'sewage smell' figures to pass on to the relevant officers and it was announced that a plastic recycling kerb-side collection will start in October. Concerns about the new Park and Ride were also passed on at the recent meeting – where we were assured that things like the lighting and possible noise pollution have been taken into consideration in the design.

We will share the data with all relevant groups once it is complete. The meeting in June will start thinking about the Action Plan needed to respond to the information and ideas - so look out for lots more information coming your way over the next few months!

Milton School Football Team win County Finals



Milton Boys Football Team 2008

There was great excitement at Milton CE Primary School on Friday 2nd May when the Yr 6 boys won the County Finals at Histon Recreation Ground.

Milton had qualified for the finals after being unbeaten all season in one of the South Cambs leagues. They then had to play against the other best schools from South Cambs: Robert Arkenstall (Haddenham), Histon and Willingham. They won all 3 of these games, before playing Abbey Meadows who had

won the City section of the finals day, to set up the County Final. Milton played really well, passing the ball fluently, supporting everyone and playing truly as a team. The final score was 1-0, which meant Milton were County Champions. They received medals and trophies after the game, and returned to school to parade them to each class, cheered from room to room.

Deputy Headteacher, John Cattermole said: "We are very proud of them. They have represented the school with pride and skill, and played wonderfully for each other as a team. In all of our matches this year they have played with a smile on their faces, encouraged each other and shown what playing as a team is all about. We are also very proud that we have continued our policy of everyone having the chance to play for the school team; the boys took it in turns to play matches so everyone played at least 3-4 games over the season. We feel strongly that sport should be for all, and as a Healthy School we aim to provide opportunities for everyone.

We could only take ten boys to the finals but the five other players who had played such a huge part in getting us to the finals were also given medals. We would like to thank Jim Hill from Cambs FA for that gesture. Our thanks also to Iain Burnham for coaching them and to parents for supporting them and helping with transport to matches this season."

International links for Milton School

Staff and pupils at Milton School welcomed teachers from Laval, Northern France, this term.

The teachers, Catherine Clopeau and Olivier Dugrand (from Le Lac and La Foret Primary Schools) and Stephane Maugeais (a peripatetic teacher), spent $1\frac{1}{2}$ days in Milton Primary School visiting every class. They were impressed by the standard of Literacy reached in Reception and Y1, enthusiastic singing and the use of SMARTboards. They enjoyed Y5's performance of Frère Jacques and KS2's performance of Lord of the Dance. KS2 pupils were taught a French action song and given cards and artwork made by French pupils.

Links between Milton and Laval began in November 2007 with a partnership conference in Paris, attended by British and French teachers including Mrs. Cutts (partnership link teacher) and Mr. Hicks (French teacher). This involved presenting information about Milton School, visiting a primary school and initiating the partnership.

Chairman's Report

The parish Council has had a busy year last year and are set to have another busy year this year.

Each year we assess how much money we need to provide services and this year we had a total income of £134, 824 which was made up of rates, rent, fees, grants and interest.

We provided a grant as we do each year to subsidise the cost of providing community facilities. This includes Milton Community Centre, our new Youth Centre, the two recreation grounds, other sports provision and associated buildings. These are all excellent facilities and are managed on our behalf by the Milton Community Centre charity.

We have a number of Committees; Finance and Staffing, Maintenance, Community Care, Youth, Planning and Community Minibus. We also have a number of ad hoc groups that look at specific issues. In addition some of our parish councillors also represent us in a specific role such as Country Park rep.

The Finance & Staffing committee manages the finances which is a major responsibility and includes items such as checking insurances and managing risk.

The Maintenance Committee has a large number of roles. It manages the cemetery, the allotments, the play areas and has general responsibility for overseeing the work of our village cleaner and the maintenance contractors who cut the grass etc.

The Community Care group oversee the work of our Community Care Warden and her assistant. There are a number of elderly residents who find this provision invaluable.

The Community Mini Bus Committee manages the use of the village mini bus which is in regular use.

The Youth Committee oversees the youth work in the village and the youth clubs that are held in the new Youth Building on a regular basis.

Planning Committee has had a very interesting year with planning applications such as the application for extending the years the landfill can operate to looking at plans for buildings on the Science Park (which incidentally is currently also part of Milton). The Planning Committee can only look at the plans and make recommendations to South Cambs. District Council who are the planning authority for the area. A developer is also currently talking to us about building a retirement village of around 100 homes on the site adjoining Milton Hall.

The Parish Council has also been involved in discussions about Mereham (a developer is hoping to build a new village called Mereham near Wilburton) and we were represented at the inquiry in the autumn.

We have also been working on getting double yellow lines at the bottom of the cycle bridge and CCTV; both of which have now been promised for this year; we have made representations to Cambridgeshire County Council about the problems of not having traffic lights on the Milton access onto to the A14/A10 interchange and have pressed the County Council to make a whole range of highways and footpath related improvements and repairs and we have represented the villages views on issues relating to the new Park and Ride that is being built in Butt Lane. We also successfully pressed for the area of land near the A14 to be cleared and tidied up.

Recently we have been writing to Anglian Water Authority asking for a meeting to discuss the problems of the smell at the sewage works which had subsided during the past 2 years but now seems to be becoming a problem again.

We supported the application from Impington Village College for a grant from South Cambs. District Council and we helped local residents by holding a stock of South Cambs. Bus Pass forms at the parish office when residents were having difficulty getting them. We also voiced the concerns of local residents when South Cambs. were threatening to close the Country Park and tried to help resolve the problems. South Cambs. have now passed the responsibility for the park to the Cambridge Sport Lakes Trust.

Unfortunately we also had a problem with South Cambs. District Council during the last year when we became most concerned that they were not responding to our letters and emails which resulted in us complaining about them and we now seem to have resolved the issues.

There is a boundary review at the moment which is likely to suggest that areas of land that are currently within the boundary of Milton be transferred to the City and visa versa. We are being consulted and have suggested that the A14 is the natural boundary of the village.

We also dealt with a problem of encroachment onto parish land and are currently working on various ideas to try to provide more land in the village for village sports teams to play. Currently some of our groups such as Colts Football have to use the facilities in other villages.

We continue to provide a mini bus to Tesco once a fortnight for the frail and elderly and once again put up Christmas lights with the help of volunteers. We also organised as usual the Remembrance Day Ceremony which was well attended.

We have also supported and funded the Parish Plan Group and will be looking at their findings in the near future.

During the last year our village cleaner, Robin Adams retired and we thanked him for all his work over 16 years. We also welcomed our new councillor Terrie Drummond.

We are in an area where there are many pressures for development and are therefore a very busy council but we are very lucky to have such a good team working on behalf of the village. I would especially like to thank everyone for all their hard work during the past year and would like to include in that thanks, the Community Centre Management Committee and all the staff.

Dog Fouling and the Law



NO FOULING

There have been numerous complaints recently of dogs fouling the village open spaces, particularly the two recreation grounds at Coles Road and The Sycamores. We would ask dog owners and persons walking dogs in

the village to abide by the law and clear up their dog's mess and place it in the dog bins around the village.

Children are at risk in the play areas and recreation grounds if dog faeces are left on

The "poop scoop" law came into force in South Cambridgeshire in 1998. 'A person in charge of a dog must clear up straightaway if that dog has defecated in an area where the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 applies.

Otherwise they are contravening the law and could be subject on conviction to a penalty of up to £1000. In Milton this law applies to all open land in the Parish, including all roads, car parks, pavements and verges, Fen Road, the river tow path, Coles Road and The Sycamores Recreation Grounds, Tomkins Mead, Milton Country Park, the Cemetery, churchyards and other open spaces around the village.

Sewage Works

Various people have contacted Anglian Water, Environmental Health etc. over the past two months to complain about the smell. Here are some reported response quotes:-

".. there has been a malfunction with the primary settlement tanks.... there has also been a burst rising main on the other side of the A14, this has led to an escape of raw sewage'

> "The issue we have is with the wet weather. The bad weather has meant that the storm lagoon has been in operation and is in the process of drying out."

".... the reason that the site appeared flooded was because the main sewage pipe had been broken. They believe that it was broken by the company who had been instructed to do some trial bore holes as part of the preliminary investigation for the redevelopment of the site.

It has also been announced by Cambridgeshire County Council that the Cambridge Waste Water Treatment Works is not to move to Honey Hill.
