UK Go Challenge Trophy winners



Congratulations to Thomas, Roella and Renzhi who recently won the UK Go Challenge Primary Schools' trophy. Roella, Thomas and Sijia also won individual prizes in their age groups.

In order to win the UK Go Challenge Primary Schools Trophy, the team from Milton Primary School had to win a match against the 2007 champions, London Meed School from Burgess Hill in Sussex.

(Go is a game which originally came from China and has been played for at least 2000 years. It is very popular in China, Japan and Korea where there are millions of players and hundreds of professional players. In Korea there are even two TV channels completely dedicated to Go! Nowadays Go is increasing in popularity around the world and around 70 countries take part in international competitions. In the UK there are about 80 Go clubs and there are approximately 30 tournaments taking place during the year. Go, along with Chess, Bridge and Draughts, will be one of the games featured in the first World Mind Sports Games being held in Beijing in October after the Olympics and Paralympics (the UK team for the games will include about 20 Go players)).



The towpath from the Penny Ferry (formerly Pike & Eel) public house in Chesterton to Clayhithe Bridge, Waterbeach, is owned by the Conservators of the River Cam. Regular towpath users will have noticed a number of benches beside the River Cam offering a chance for people to take the weight from their feet or to enjoy a peaceful lunch break or some quiet contemplation. Some of the older wooden benches have fallen into disrepair and metal replacements are now favoured for their durability.

Members of the public may request a memorial bench by contacting the River Manager. Any request would be tabled to the committee of Conservators as a matter for decision at a future quarterly meeting. The next meeting of the Conservators is on 15th January 2009. The person making the request would be expected to pay for the bench and the costs of its emplacement.

Milton Youth Club Report

This is a report and information for the past 5 months at both Junior and senior youth clubs in Milton. I have been lead worker on the youth clubs as cover for Sophie Lucas from May-September 2008. Sophie will be taking the lead on both groups from 16th September and I will be pulling out of both projects in order to concentrate on my work in other areas.

The numbers of attendance were steady with around 20-25 young people attending each club. However since the new academic year has started numbers have risen to 30 and above at some sessions this term. This is due to a new batch of year 7's attending in the junior group and a large group of year 9's moving up into the senior club.

There has been lots of activities that the young people have been involved in at both clubs. The junior club have enjoyed sessions where we have brought in arts and crafts, as a lot of the group are artistic and creative. They also participated in lots of sports activities outside, especially over the summer when the weather has been fine, as well as cooking in the kitchen.

The senior club has been involved a lot more in cooking sessions such as making pizzas, pancakes and fruit smoothies which many of the group have enjoyed. They also regularly set up large table tennis and pool tournaments for the club which are run and organised by the young people, which has given them good organisation, communication and leadership skills. The senior group are also very sports orientated and often play multiple sports outside.

During the summer holidays we had a large barbeque and we did this by combining the two clubs for one night. This went extremely well and the young people were instrumental in the cooking and organising of the event. The two clubs worked together very well and we had extremely high numbers of young people attending of over 75, which was fantastic. All the young people enjoyed this event and have expressed the desire to do this again and I'm sure Sophie would be happy to do this.

We have had four young people from the senior club volunteer and help out with the junior club. All four young people have shown good skills and attitudes, showing a lot of maturity and enthusiasm. As a result the young people have been able to receive Cambridgeshire Youth Awards for their hard work and dedication, which the young people can put on their CV's and is a valuable accreditation to receive. Overall I have enjoyed working on this project over the last 5 months and have been pleased with the attitude and behaviour of all the young people at both clubs. The young people are always a delight to work with and I am sure the clubs will remain popular and successful in the future.

New Rules make Marriage in Church easier!

From 1st October 2008, the rules about who qualifies to be married in Church have been changed, which means that more people will find it easier to get married in the Church of their choice.

A couple continue to have the right to be married in the parish Church of a parish where one or both of them are resident or entered on the church electoral roll. However, under the new rules, those who can establish a 'Qualifying Connection' with a particular parish Church will also now be able to be married there.

A Qualifying Connection with a particular parish Church is likely to exist if a person was baptized in the parish, had their confirmation registered in the parish, has lived in the parish for at least six months (at any time), or has regularly attended that Church for at least six months (again, at any time). Also, if a parent or grandparent was married in the parish Church, or if a parent had lived in the parish or regularly attended that Church for at least six months at any time during the person's lifetime, then a Qualifying Connection may exist.

This is good news for many couples, because it makes it possible, for example, to be married in the parish where one of them grew up, even if their parents have since moved elsewhere.

I am very pleased with these changes, because it means that we can extend a warm welcome to even more couples who wish to be married at All Saints.

As you may know, since 2002, it has been possible, in certain circumstances, for those who are divorced to have a second marriage in Church. Nothing in the new rules changes the procedure for this, and I welcome enquiries from those who might wish to explore the possibility of such a marriage at All Saints.

Cyclebridge Saved

Retirement Homes
