





Neighbourhood Watch

At present the Milton Parish Police liaison group are in the process of setting up a new **Milton Neighbourhood Watch Scheme.** We are planning on having a semi launch at the Milton Fair in July.

So what is Neighbourhood Watch? (in some areas known as Home Watch).

It is one of the biggest and most successful crime prevention schemes ever. It is based on simple ideas and values that are shared by many people around the country:

Getting together with your neighbours to reduce local crime and disorder in the bid to make your neighbourhood a safe and better place to live, work and play.

Neighbourhood Watch is not just about reducing crime — it is about building community spirit and good relations. It brings local people closer together with common goals; to tackle crime and disorder and to keep an eye on each other's property. There are also other benefits of joining a Neighbourhood Watch scheme. For example, you can learn more about crime prevention and home security which will help keep your home and belongings safe. You might also get a discount on your home insurance.

The aims of Neighbourhood Watch schemes are:

- To reduce the opportunities for crime and anti-social behaviour to occur in your neighbourhood by deterring wouldbe burglars and vandals.
- To build a community spirit so that all residents can contribute towards the protection of their property through cooperation and communication.

Members of Watch schemes are not vigilantes. Patrolling the streets is a job for the police; they will act upon the information supplied by residents. Watch schemes are not police-run groups. However, in order to be effective in tackling crime, Watch schemes have to work in partnership with the police (and other agencies).

By letting the police know of anything suspicious that you see or hear, you are helping to reduce the opportunities for crime to occur. The more difficult it can be made for the criminal, the more likely it is that crime can be reduced.

MILTON W.I.

In March we had our AGM so we had one of our own members. Jan Chessum as our Speaker, she also happens to be the County Representative for the W.I. College called 'Denman' which is situated in the Oxfordshire village of Marcham. Jan gave a power point presentation of this beautiful college situated in 17 acres of beautiful gardens. It is called 'Denman' after the first national chairman of the W.I., Lady Denman, who was the founder of the Womens Land Army and also a supporter of the suffragette movement. She explained that there are Courses on a very wide range of subjects ranging from crafts of all kinds to computer Courses and walking, architecture and more. Around 500 Courses a year, also all rooms are en suite and you are pampered and the food is excellent. No good being on a diet.

Then in April in time for the start of the gardening season Peter Jackson from Scotsdales Garden Centre had everyone enthralled with all the wonderful plants he had brought along with him. He explained how we should look after a wide range of very differing plants and how easy or difficult it can be for us to either make them thrive or die. Some members realised that they should start to feed some of their poor suffering plants. We also learnt how to propagate certain plants and that we should also realise that some plants like acid soils and others prefer lime soil. Rhododendrons and azaleas prefer acid soils, but the growers are now grafting rhododendrons on to a root stock that will tolerate lime soil. This means that we can grow these type of rhododendrons in our gardens here in Milton. You have to look for 'INKARHO' on the label.

Peter was a very interesting speaker and told us some of the things he

got up to in his kitchen when the 'Queen' was out. In June our speaker will be Gerry Metcalfe speaking on Forensic Science (Questioned documents) which sounds extremely interesting. July our speaker will be Deana Hudson and the title of her talk is 'The

Mistress, her Maid and the Men in their lives'. Intriguing!!!!! This year is the 90th anniversary of the formation of the County Federation so there are some special celebrations being arranged. On 25 July there will be a Hog Roast and Steel Band at Landbeach in the village hall and the recreation ground. Also in July there is a tour of Queens College, a visit to Wisley RHS gardens, a day school on Long and Short Stitch Embroidery and Beaded Blackberries, also our Darts final. In June there is our national AGM which this year is at the Royal Albert Hall in London. We have some very good speakers and also this is where we discuss and vote on our resolutions. This year there is just one Resolution, which is 'SOS for Honey bees'. As an organisation we have a lot of influence on government both here and in Europe when it comes to environmental issues. We were formed as a campaigning and educating organisation and we are still that today. We work closely with government on these issues but we are strictly 'non political'.

Meeting with Tesco - report

A group of Parish Councillors and the County Councillor recently met with the manager of Tesco. This is a report of that meeting: "We were told they do check and repair the lights in the side passage regularly. They are not supposed to be on during the day. On the question of people preferring not to use that passage, the manager saw the path across the grass by The Rowans and said a bid for

a grant to put in a path there could go in for the next bidding round.

The manager agreed that the graffiti on the pillars should be removed, and also agreed to paint the pillars and soffit boards facing The Rowans, where the paint is flaking. They do litter pick it, and will try to improve the cleanliness.

He has agreed to make sure their grounds maintenance contractor cuts back the shrubs off the road at The Rowans. They hope the new contractor this year will keep the grass cut better than was the case last year - they know it was unacceptable.

Litter picking - the Environment Group did a litter pick at that end of the village on Saturday 21st Feb. Tesco will also try to smarten up the litter collection (especially bags caught in shrubs and trees, and the planting by the bus stop).

We spent some time discussing the parent and child spaces and the disabled spaces. He agreed to look at paying more attention to enforcement (eg putting flyers or stickers on windscreens if people are parked in the wrong area). They do tolerate disabled people who cannot walk far parking in the parent and child spaces near the door, which is sensible. We saw the trolley park by the cash dispensers so full that parents and children would need to walk behind the parked cars, and he promised to do something to stop that - the trolleys should be behind the yellow plastic bump strip.

The entrance to the store is soon going to have doors added - not on the sides where we walk in at present, but parallel to the screen at the front - so there will be an 'outside' covered lobby and an 'inside' covered lobby. People should still not be smoking in the 'outside' lobby. The aim is to reduce the heat lost by the doors being open all the time. Tesco are aiming to reduce their electricity bills by half, we were

told. They have already fitted new efficient boilers last year.

This month there is a planning application for a wind turbine on the left of the entrance, near the service road.

The car parking layout is designed by a dept at Head Office and once laid out, is very difficult to change. Although the route one takes into the car park seems absurd it serves their purpose (making everyone drive twice past the petrol station). We talked about pedestrian and cycle access - they are not prepared to change anything, but we were told the zebra crossings are due to be repainted soon and the lights in the Belisha beacons are about to be repaired.
