

Thank you so much for including my request for used Postage Stamps for Charities in the December issue of Village View. You will be pleased to hear that it has led to a marked increase in donations of stamps received through collection points at Milton Parish Church and at the Post Office (thanks to Anil).

I have received a number of differing enquiries about the 'used stamps project' may I take this opportunity to answer a few. I have been operating this collection and dispatch to a number of International Christian-based Missions for about 4 years in the Milton/Cambridge area, and am always keen to learn of others who would benefit. Following the collection, I sort the stamps into categories and remove excess 'envelope', though I would appreciate if donors could be lavish rather than meagre with margins around stamps. Any and all stamps are welcome - UK and foreign, all through the year - this includes postage due stamps, Royal Mail postage labels and Registered letter stamps/labels. First day of issue stamps should be left intact as they are worth considerably more on their Stamp albums and complete envelopes. collections are very welcome, but please do not give away the children's inheritance without careful consideration!

Finally - is it all worth the effort? The Leprosy Mission, one of the recipients, recently wrote to say that along with donations of coins and medals, they realised over £72,000 from last year's sales alone!

From the Desk of the Parish Council Chairman

Proposed Retirement Village on Elv Road

As I mentioned in the last issue of this magazine, the parish has a one-time option either to lease playing fields (with a purpose-built sports pavilion and car park) at the proposed retirement village or to receive a cash sum (of £200,000) which would be used to provide recreation space elsewhere in the village. We have received letters from residents giving their views on this issue. Some have asked for more information. The size of the area to be leased would be just under four acres, or the size of two junior football pitches. I would like to stress that, although it is specified in the lease that the fields shall be prepared to Football Association (FA) standards, the playing fields would be for general recreation use and not limited to football. If the parish decides not to lease the fields, they will be incorporated into the rest of the Humphry Repton landscape which the developer is restoring at the former EDF site.

The Parish Council has consulted with clubs affiliated with the Milton Community Centre and one of their main concerns is that the parcel of land offered for lease is not large enough to accommodate their needs. This brings up the issue of alternative sites. For over a decade (since the parish sold some recreation land to make way for the sheltered housing scheme, Barnabas Court), the Parish Council has been actively trying to acquire land within the village for recreation use. One site adjacent to Landbeach Road would potentially offer more land, but there is a concern for the safety of children crossing the A10. The parish council is currently looking into another site adjacent to Ely Road across from the College of West Anglia. Although there is obvious benefit for the parish to own rather than lease recreation space, you are no doubt well aware that land does not come cheaply, and there are associated costs as well, such as preparing the ground for recreation use, construction of a pavilion with changing rooms, car park, etc.

I believe it is vital that the parish makes the right choice on this issue. The topic will be discussed at the Annual Parish Meeting on Monday April 19th, and I encourage all residents who have views on the issue to attend that meeting. As negotiations continue, I hope the parish council will be in a position to shed more light on possible alternative sites at that time.

I would like to welcome PCSO John Mason, the new Police Community Support Officer for Milton. John replaces PCSO Claire Whiteman. On behalf of the village, I have thanked Claire for her hard work and commitment to Milton and wished her every success in her new placement.

Youth

Milton Action for Youth was set up some time ago to help oversee the youth work in the village and activities which are held in the Milton Youth Centre adjacent to The Sycamores Recreation ground. They have received a grant from Awards for All (the Lottery grants scheme), which has been applied to providing First Aid training, a Babysitting Course, and a Youth Work Course for the Girls Club. A girls group now meets weekly in addition to the junior and senior clubs. You can find out more about Milton Action for Youth by attending the Annual Parish Meeting on April 19th.

Double yellow lines on Industrial Estate

Representatives from Milton Country Park and local business owners have requested the Parish Council's assistance in installing double yellow lines along the Cambridge Road Industrial Estate. The Parish Council has been facilitating negotiations with the County Council and a plan is being developed to install double yellow lines along much of the industrial estate due to parking and traffic safety concerns.

Our Community Care scheme received grants from Cambridgeshire County and South Cambridgeshire District Councils and continues to provide vital services for Milton residents. In addition, the Milton Charities continue to support the scheme. Our clerk, Jim Daniels, is very proud of this scheme and believes it is one of the largest in South Cambridgeshire. Community Care Warden Tracey Ebbon and her assistant Linda Harding are doing excellent work and I commend them on their service and dedication. The Parish Council would be delighted to receive any donations towards this excellent scheme which enables elderly residents to lead independent lives in their own homes.

Maureen went to college in 1961 and never returned to live in the village. The birth of their Grandson Julian in 1970 brought them great happiness. A month later Chris's Mother passed away. With Maureen living in Oxfordshire Nell and Chris were alone at last but then another problem arose to mar their happiness, Nellie suddenly developed severe depression an illness she was to have for the next 16 years. The arrival of their second grandson Duncan brought more happiness and both boys fondly remember their time spent with Grandad Field, as he was known, on his allotment. Grandad was able to cut the thinnest slices of buttered bread and when staying in Milton both boys would get up early and go down for their "butter bread" and sit on a tiny stool to eat it. But Nellie's illness persisted and folk in the village would say Chris should give her a kick up the backside, but he always stood by her and didn't complain. When collecting her death certificate, just 3 months before their Golden Wedding, he just said to the doctor "You don't know what my life has been like." Doctors just pumped Nellie full of tranquillisers but Maureen, suffering from the same illness, knows that she had Obsessive Compulsive Disorder and now this can readily be treated if correctly diagnosed.

Aged 77 Chris was now alone but he had his allotment and greenhouses in his garden to keep him busy. He had worked an allotment all his married life and as additional unwanted plots became available he would take them on to prevent the weeds spreading. He single-handedly cultivated over an acre of land specialising in asparagus, strawberries and raspberries which 'Tommy' took to market. He was well into his 80s when he finally gave up the land but then a neighbour offered Chris part of his garden and he tended this for a few more years.

He bought himself Sky TV and would sit for hours watching sport, even getting up in the night to watch boxing matches or American wrestling. He never read a book in his life but he was an avid reader of Teletext and knew just what was going on in the world. During those lonely times he had a good friend Lily Wilkin who visited him almost daily for 16 of the 18 years he lived alone. To be continued in the June issue
