Milton's Foodshare Goes National!

After starting in Milton only nine months ago, the Foodshare project has just been launched across the UK with over 5,000 primary school children, allotments, kitchen gardeners and over 100 charities already signed up. 'Food Philanthropy' has been sweeping the country since Foodshare appeared on BBC Breakfast TV and was introduced to the 2.5m listeners of Radio 4's Gardeners Question Time with unanimous praise from the panel.

The volunteer-run project, which encourages people to grow food and donate surplus produce to local charities, has now been endorsed by the RHS, Garden Organic, Sustain and The National Society of Allotments and Leisure Gardeners. Foodshare also recently launched a brand new web site - www.foodshare.co.uk.

School Harvest Heroes

Foodshare and Milton Primary School are piloting an exciting new project called "Harvest Heroes". As well as growing food for the Milton Children's Hospice (EACH) on their school allotment, every pupil is taking home a Foodshare plant which has been grown from seed in the classroom. They are continuing to grow the plant with their family who will enjoy half of the produce, with the other half donated to the Hospice kitchen.

Fly Posting is an Offence

Fly posting is an offence for which the person responsible for the placing of the advert or the beneficiary may be prosecuted via a Fixed Penalty Notice £75 fine. (Anti Social Behaviour Act) However the placing of minor small posters is not normally penalised ie fetes, car boots etc as long as the poster is removed after the event. Otherwise it can be classed as littering for which there is another FPN available.

Items /posters attached to road side furniture or a structure on the highway is also an offence for which again there is an FPN of £75 (under the Highways Act).
