Greater Cambridge Partnership

The Greater Cambridge Partnership (GCP) has recently launched two public consultations on proposals to help people move around the area more easily and sustainably.

The 'Cambridge Eastern Access' consultation asks for views on proposals for cycling and walking improvements on Newmarket Road, while the 'Making Connections' consultation is part of the GCP's City Access project and asks for views on proposals to transform public transport, cycling and walking as well as reducing pollution and congestion in the area.

Parish Council Chairman's Report

Milton Parish Council has been busy into the Autumn with some exciting projects in-hand.

We now have our own Facebook page at https://www.facebook.com/miltonvillage.org.uk, where we will post items of general interest from our meetings.

You will see the poster for our art competition on p.13. We are planning to improve the look of all the bus stops in the village, and we're starting with the curved green shelters. We hope for some exciting designs to come from village residents or groups to liven up those shelters.

We resited the bus stop at Landbeach Road so that passengers could step (or roll) from the tarmac into the front door of the bus, and placed the shelter further along the road. This was requested by a disabled passenger.

At the end of Humphries Way, I recently planted a new cherry tree given to us by South Cambs Council. In November, we will have more trees to plant at the new orchard on Ely Road, adding to those we planted in the spring.

Our "Safer Streets/20 mph" group is working with the Waterbeach developers who are proposing a much improved cycle path through the village. If these issues interest you, why not become a Parish Councillor? The Parish Council now has 3 vacancies, and we are actively seeking new members: if you are interested in being co-opted please contact the Clerk on 861447.



And finally some thanks: in late August, our previous Chairman Don Wildman resigned and I would like to thank him for his dedicated service to the village over many years.

Incredibly, the house where my wife and I live in Milton is no more than 100 yards, from that of the couple we met on holiday. You couldn't make it up but it's all true! Sometimes, real life is stranger and more miraculous than fiction.

Wildlife Notes

It always feels sad when the clocks go back—it's nearly dark and not yet 5pm as I write this. However, let's try to stay positive and look out for the wildlife sights that are special to Autumn and Winter. I had a walk in the Country Park a couple of weeks back and I'd never seen so few water birds on the lakes. Yesterday, things were looking up and winter visitors were clearly starting to arrive. There wasn't much going on on Todd's Pit, but on Dickerson's there were many more gadwall and tufted ducks than my previous visit. Also, I think I saw two little grebes, a very distant pochard, and my highlight was a teal, possibly accompanied by two females, although I couldn't see their green wing patches. If I've only an hour or so free for a walk, a perambulation around the park with my binoculars will be a worthwhile activity.


Slightly further afield, a walk I discovered last Spring was over to the west of the Mere Way. There are some County Council-owned tenant farms over there. One of the tenants is doing sterling work for wildlife. There are permissive paths, presumably part of a higher level stewardship scheme, and three woods have been planted; all named Landbeach Woods. Clearly the woods are on the worst land for farming as by last March they were under several inches of water. They've been dry so far this Autumn and the colours are very pretty. There are also fields that have margins that are clearly planted to be food for wildlife and hedgerows full of berries. The light wasn't kind, nor the distance, so identification of large numbers of small birds flitting around was tricky; I'd say "mixed flocks of tits and finches" would be a fair estimation. Actually, the sound and presence of so many birds was what pleased me, not identifying species. In so many places, you can do a country walk and only see wood pigeons and crows and feel the whole area is dead, so the abundant life that was present in these fields made it really special. Maybe next time I do this walk, some redwings and fieldfares will have arrived? Hopefully the farmer is being recognised for the good land and wildlife stewardship being undertaken.
