
Cambridge Open Studios

This year, four artists are taking part in Cambridge Open Studios in Milton, on the first three weekends of July. Alison Hullyer, Chris and Jane Thomas in Hall End and Cheryl Bird and Linda Bartlett on the High Street. This is a chance to see what some of the artists in Milton have been producing over the last year. Look out for the yellow flags.

Open Studios will be spread throughout the whole region including many villages around Royston, Saffron Walden, St Ives and Chatteris, as well as Ely and central Cambridge. It will feature an exciting range of exhibitions by over 300 artists, 40 of them new. It will run over the weekends of July 3–4, 10–11, 17–18 and 24–25, with studios being open between 11am and 6pm.

Chisholm Trail Jetty Opens

Work on the jetty path linking Stourbridge Common with Ditton Meadows (under the railway bridge on the South side) is now complete and open for public use.

Phase one of the trail will open later this year, linking Cambridge North Railway Station with Coldhams Lane.



New NHS Palliative Care Service

The NHS has launched a new service to provide out-of-hours end-of-life palliative care via NHS 111 option 3. The very new service is live now.

Callers are directed to a Palliative Care Clinical Nurse, not a generalist, so specific advice may be given.

The service is currently available in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough from 17:30 to 09:30 weekdays and 24 hours over the weekends.

This out of hours, free-of-charge availability for end of life care is the first for our region. Many other regions in the UK have had out-of-hours coverage, though often via fee-based services. Eventually the service is envisioned to be 24/7.

Recipes from Arthur Rank (p.9)

Fruits of the Forest Brownie

Ingredients

200g quality milk chocolate 170g salted butter 270g soft dark brown sugar 4 medium size eggs 60g plain flour 35g cocoa powder 135g frozen mixed berries

Method

- 1. Heat the oven to 160 degrees C.
- 2. Grease and line a tray with baking parchment.
- 3. Gently melt the chocolate, butter and dark brown sugar in a saucepan.
- 4. Stir every now and then and once it's all melted, leave to cool.
- Once the mixture is cool, add one egg at a time and stir in.
- Once all the eggs are added, stir in the flour and cocoa powder.
- 7. Pour mixture into the tray and spread around.
- 8. Sprinkle the frozen mixed berries evenly.
- 9. Cook for 30 min or until a crust is formed.

Chocolate Biscuit Cake

Ingredients:

250g butter

50g sugar

2 eggs

250g chocolate chips (melted)

250g biscuits (crushed)

Method:

- 1. Gently melt the butter and sugar together in a saucepan, until the sugar dissolves.
- 2. Take it off the heat while you whisk the eggs, then add the eggs into the butter and sugar.
- 3. Add the melted chocolate to the mix.
- 4. Fold in the broken biscuits.
- 5. Pour into a greased tray.
- 6. Now the hardest part—leave for 6 hours in a fridge to set, before cutting into portions.


Wildlife Notes

In my last column I commented on the wet winter we'd had. Several press reports confirm my impression that April was high in the records for both dryness and cold; my commutes have been in normal footwear rather than wellies but with winter coat, scarf, hat and thick gloves! At least I didn't have to scrape a windscreen; a fate many drivers setting off early will have had all month. Certainly a Blackthorn Winter to remember; there is still some in flower in some places in Milton at the very beginning of May when normally we would be expecting hawthorn to have been in full flower for at least a few days now. There is some hawthorn just starting in the Country Park but the only place it's in full flower that I've spotted is on Milton Road south of the A14 roundabout. Interestingly, the parallel Cowley Road is where the blackthorn is often up to a couple of weeks earlier to flower. If you headed further away from the warming effect of the city, as we are now permitted to do, there were still masses of blackthorn in full glorious flower at the very end of April. At least most trees are now coming fully into leaf; a notable exception are ash trees which are always later than the rest.

The birdsong is currently at its peak, as I start to write this column on International Dawn Chorus Day; sadly the very cold nights put me off going out before 4am to hear the beginning of the dawn chorus, which is always lovely in the Country Park and the countryside around Milton. I saw a blackcap singing from a tree by the river when I cycled to work one morning in late April and am hearing plenty of chiff-chaffs. I may have heard a few other migratory warblers, but I'm not expert enough to tell them apart. I'd seen possibly a couple of swallows near the A14 bridge over the river. Cycling to work on the very cold day following May Bank Holiday, there were masses of swallows flying very low over the river, feeding, all the way from Baits Bite lock to Chesterton. Whether they had arrived here as their final destination, or were feeding while on passage, is unknown, but hopefully the ones who regularly nest in the structure of the A14 bridge will be properly in residence soon. By the time you read this, the weather should be warmer and there will be swifts over Milton; several residents have nest boxes on their houses, so there is a good chance of hearing their characteristic screaming call in the village.
