
ground, next door to the sports pavilion. All welcome for our very first event!

Parking Charges at Milton Park & Ride

Last September Cambridgeshire County Council proposed new parking charges at all park & ride sites, including ours in Butt Lane on the other side of the A10.

There were obvious concerns that this was likely to increase parking on Butt Lane, Coulson Close and other roads in that area and also about increased traffic in Butt Lane from people

in their cars hurrying to get the bus to work at a time when children are heading for Milton Primary School. According to *Cambridge News*, nearly 200 objections were submitted.

As a result some changes are now being proposed by the council. Firstly, charges are as follows:

■ Up to 1 hour - free

- Between 1 hour and 18 hours £1
- Between 18 hours and 24 hours £10

Secondly, they intend to put double yellow lines on Butt Lane, but according to a post on milton-chat by our county councillor Maurice Leeke this will be on the other side of the A10, not in Milton:

"The county council's Cabinet has also said that it will undertake a survey of the level of parking in Butt Lane, Coulson Close and Humphries Way before and after the introduction of the parking charge, to see what effect if any the parking charge has on parking there. There is not a commitment to introduce any particular scheme as a result.

I think the way forward is to see what the effect is first, before deciding what needs to be done about it. The solution does not need to be double lines down the whole length of Butt Lane with residents' parking bays, for instance - there are other options. But let's see the symptoms before prescribing the medicine."

Your parish council is also aware of the issue and will be monitoring the situation.

Changes to Green Bin Collection

During the winter months, green bin waste will be collected monthly. That change is part of South Cambridgeshire District Council's new budget needed to create savings equivalent to $\pounds 20$ for every band D home. They say that these will have minimal impact on residents as during the winter most people are not cutting their grass and the amount of garden waste being collected halves.

Based on the original proposal, a survey of Milton residents was set up and completed by 147 people in 3 days. The survey, in which 60% of respondents s upported the proposal (www.milton.org.uk/opus2696) was presented at the subsequent SCDC cabinet meeting.




From the Archives 25 Years Ago: April 1989

The agency have investigated the matter and found that some new aerials placed in the north of the village have been interfering with the BBC signals. This appears to have now been dealt with.

In response to patient comments and requests we are trialling a new appointment system from April 1st. You will no longer have to queue outside to get an appointment for that day.

The new system allows you to book next day routine GP appointment slots online, by phone or in person from 3pm on the previous working day. If you feel that your problem cannot wait till the next day please phone the surgery and the receptionist will help you.

The surgery will open its doors and phone lines at 8am. If you come to the surgery on the day or queue outside to get a morning appointment these may have gone. However, any available appointments 9:40-11am will be offered to you.

I'm happy to report that your parish council has voted to keep the village precept at the current level for 2014-15. Since our tax base has increased over the past year, this actually represents a decrease of 0.36% for a band D property in Milton. This is the third year in a row that the precept has remain unchanged and we trust that this will help residents and families in the current economic climate.

Pupils from Milton Primary School gave a presentation to the parish council at the March meeting. Jodie, Megan, Noah and Joe spoke very eloquently and presented the school's survey results on ways to improve Milton for children. Short and long term ideas were offered, including a water fountain at the Country Park, a swimming pool and a chocolate factory! A sub-committee was set up last Autumn to recommend future open space/community facility projects, and the pupils' suggestions will be part of their deliberations.



The East of England Ambulance NHS Trust has supplied the village with an automated external defibrillator as part of their Community Public Access Defibrillator (CPAD) project. Thompson Electrical very kindly agreed to install the apparatus for us free of charge as a service to the village. The defibrillator cabinet has been mounted on the wall of our Bowls Pavilion (opposite the surgery). The CPAD was launched on 26th February and is now ready for use. This is a terrific resource for our village. Many thanks to the East of England Ambulance NHS Trust and Thompson Electrical!

Our parish clerk, Sue Humphreys, has stepped down. I would like to thank Sue for all her hard work whilst clerk. And I would like to welcome our new parish clerk, Gemma Faulkner. Gemma has already started on the job and we wish her all the best in her new appointment.

Finally, I would like to ask everyone to respect the cycle lanes throughout the village, especially outside the chiropractor's, and refrain from parking in these areas.

Wildlife Notes

Although this Winter has been mild, I feel so relieved to have seen something of the sun recently. In January and February I was commuting in wellies as it was either raining, had been raining, or was about to chuck it down. The blackthorn on Cowley Road, the riverbank and in the Country Park knows it has been mild as it is about two weeks earlier than last year. I wonder if we will have a cold snap and it will stall like it did last year, when it was in flower for about a month.

I've been hearing occasional drumming of great spotted woodpeckers in various places since mid-January. They have now been joined by a chiff-chaff in the Country Park, possibly one that overwintered around here, rather than a very early arrival. The vellowhammer on Fen Road has started singing again: so far, I haven't heard an answer to his song. The great crested grebes in the Country Park are in full "Spring dress" and have been since mid-February. There are a pair of them at the northern end of Todd's, and the pair of swans are back in their normal place: a little island in the reed bed, out of the incredibly high water.

The second Sunday of March hit the News for being warm: the brimstone butterflies thought so as well, and came out. We have had birds "inspecting" our nest boxes and I've seen other behaviour indicating birds are starting to nest: collection of non-food items from our garden such as twigs and feathers. Also a grey squirrel collecting dead crocosmia leaves! All good reasons for not being too tidy in the garden, as well as hoping we might get a hedgehog coming and looking for food under the leaf and plant litter.

Sewage Treatment Centre Report

Hazel Smith and Anna Bradnam were given a guided tour of the Cambridge Sewage Treatment Centre in December 2013. Here is Anna's report.

The Centre was first established in 1895 and is currently run by Anglian Water. It receives all the sewage from Cambridge City and outlying villages. The treatment process is continuous and monitored from a control centre in Lincoln: day-to-day a team of just 2-3 people look after the site locally.



A series of mechanical and biological processes eliminate waste in the form of paper, plastic, grit, stones, organic material, particulate matter, fatty deposits and phosphates, before it is released to the river, just south of the A14 river bridge.

Fresh sewage is about 90% water and odour free whilst it is aerated and moving. Normally the system processes around 1.276 litres per second. During rainstorms, the plant may have to handle 4,000 litres per second. In this case sewage is pumped into overflow tanks and once the organic matter has settled out, the liquid is pumped into the 15 million litre storm lagoon to await treatment. Southerly winds can carry the odour from this lagoon across Milton.

What to do if you smell sewage: All odour incidents should be reported quickly to the Lincoln Control Centre on 0800 145145 or 01522 341000. Refer to the "CambST" (Cambridge Sewage Treatment Centre) and say "Advice is required", so they will report back to you about the problem. Anglian Water will be able to check the plant data remotely and will liaise directly with the staff at Cowley Road. This means that all complaints are logged and they can take action to improve the situation. Staff from Anglian Water will attend the Annual Parish Meeting in April to explain what they do to avoid odour.

Improving Home **Energy Efficiency**
