# **Bin Day Changes**

Shortly after the last Village View went to press, South Cambs announced that the bin collections for South Cambridgeshire and Cambridge City were joining forces, and as a result, the bin collection schedules would all change.

Since 27th February, Milton's bin collections have been on Fridays, rather than the previous Tuesdays. You can see the full schedule on their website:

Reminder: extra recycling can be left by the blue bin in a returnable container or cardboard box (or clear plastic sack). Extra garden waste can be taken to the Household Waste & Recycling Centre on Butt Lane.

The savings of the new scheme will be £700,000 over three years with 20,000 fewer miles travelled.

# Waterbeach Development — Survey

An outline planning application has now been submitted for up to 6,500 new homes and associated facilities situated on land to the north of the village Waterbeach.

Any comments you make should be based on material planning considerations only and be received by **10 April**.

# **Police & Parking Problems**

I am aware from the many emails South Cambs officers receive and from Neighbourhood Panel meetings that parking is a constant concern for many residents in villages across South Cambridgeshire.

Many of you may know that I cannot prioritise parking patrols over investigating and preventing crime and responding to calls for service. In light of this, it means that my officers might not do as much parking enforcement as many of you would like.

I have been giving some thought on how we can meet your expectations on parking enforcement and I have decided that we are going to try something new. I have therefore set up an online webpage where you can report concerns about parking. The information that you give us will go directly to me and will help us build a picture of the exact hot-spots for parking issues. I will then use this information on targeted 'crack-down' days. There is some good evidence that crack-downs work in other areas of policing so we are going to try it for parking. For obvious reasons I will not be publicising the dates of the crackdowns in advance, but updates will be sent to you by e-cops, Twitter and Facebook once we have completed a crackdown day

I am not pretending that this will solve all parking problems, however, I do think that it strikes the right balance between dealing with parking concerns and the other important work that we do.

#### No Bread for Ducks!

Spring is here, and many families will head to the Country Park and other waterways to feed the ducks and watch the ducklings growing.



#### Did vou know?

The Canal & River Trust are asking everyone who feeds our ducks to consider swapping the usual white bread for something a little healthier, and keep the waterways healthy for all the wildlife that depends on them.



For the final session of 2017 on 11<sup>th</sup> April we welcome David Chamberlin, our rector, to speak about "Jesus, the Resurrection and the Life". At our first lunch Gareth Howles (left), a theological student at Ridley Hall, gave us lots to think about as he challenged us to reflect the light of Christ within our own lives.

Future meetings include a celebration of Mothers' Union within the local area. Mothers' Union members from across the deanery will

be joining us for a service of Holy Communion on 2<sup>nd</sup> May at 7.30 pm.

In many areas of the world, Mothers' Union members are active in supporting people in prison, and families whose lives are impacted by imprisonment. In developing countries Mothers' Union take in food and clothing and spend time with prisoners in prayer. When prisoners have their children in prison with them, Mothers' Union members do all they can to improve conditions for these children, providing blankets and fruit and vegetables to supplement the poor provision of the prison diet.

Within the UK & Ireland, Mothers' Union is active in 112 prisons, including 14 women's prisons and three mother and baby units. Members' support is given to prisoners and their families in a variety of ways, depending on need. Throughout, members seek to help families sustain and develop their relationships whilst separated by imprisonment.

On 6<sup>th</sup> June at 7.30 pm we welcome Rita Evans, an MU member from Birmingham, who will be talking about work that she undertakes in prison. We also hope to catch up with projects that our own members are engaged in at a local prison. Everyone is invited to join us for what promises to be a most informative evening.

# Wildlife Notes

The Guardian had a really valuable article on 2<sup>nd</sup> March about hedgehogs: it's worth going to the website and using the search tool to find it, as there was far more useful information than I can put here, with many interesting links. I saw my first hedgehog in Milton before the end of February, a couple of days after I'd started putting out food for them, spurred on by having seen bats out of hibernation along the river on my way home from work.

How can we help this endangered, harmless and popular mammal in Milton? *Firstly*, when out in the car after dark, any time from about mid-February to late November, please take care and slow down so you are in a position to be able to stop. *Secondly*, there are many areas of housing in Milton with gardens that abut onto others, possibly only with narrow roads or paths splitting them up. If hedgehogs can easily get in and out of these gardens, they have access to many more areas where food (worms, beetles, slugs, other invertebrates) can be hunted. A small gap at the very bottom of a fence, wall or gate, about the size of a CD case, will suffice. *Thirdly*, gardens that have areas that are a bit overgrown, or have a woodpile, or a very thickly grown patch are more valuable in terms of both food-finding and daytime bedding-down. It doesn't have to look terribly untidy – dense areas of shrubs that you maybe hide fallen leaves and other garden debris under, where you can't see it, will help. *Fourthly*, if you want to ensure you really are on their route, why not set up your own feeding station as shown in the diagram?



Dry cat biscuits (chicken not fish), sunflower hearts and dried mealworms all seem fairly popular. If you're really interested to see your nocturnal visitors, many garden centres now sell infra-red camera systems. Placed low on the ground, pointing at the bowl, you too can be lucky enough to see a spikey bottom possibly sitting in the food bowl!

#### Sergeant 1881458 Alfred Frank Butcher, Air Gunner 49 Sqdn.

We recently received a request from a Mr Claude Archambault on behalf of the mayor of a small village in France named Le Coudray-Saint Germer to trace relatives of Alfred Frank Butcher. With the help of Alfred Frank Butcher's grandsons we have been able to put this together for Mr Archambault.

Sgt. Butcher was aircrew in a Lancaster which was shot down whilst returning from a mission to Munich, on the 7th January 1945. He was aged 35. He is buried in the Old Communal Cemetery of Villeneuve-Saint Georges near Paris. He was married with 6 children and a pregnant wife. He volunteered for service in the RAF even though he was exempt due to his occupation: Cambridge University at the Plant Breeding Institute at Huntingdon Road employed him as an agricultural worker. He enlisted in 1943 because of his younger brother's death. During the weeks before his death the crew had completed missions in Czechia, France and Belgium.

Alfred had 7 children: Hugh from Beck Row (passed on), John lives on the Isle of Wight, Frank (Pat) from Milton (passed on), Mick lives in Chesterton, Paul from Milton (passed on), Veronica lives in Ely and Lynne who lives in Pennsylvania USA. Pat had two sons, Steve and Ian. Their nan, Alfred's widow, was called Grace and died in 1985. Alfred's father was the Milton village blacksmith and the family home was Pembroke House opposite the Lion and Lamb.
