Another milestone reached in delivery of Northstowe new town

Gallagher's development of the first phase of Northstowe is a step closer after the joint committee of members of South Cambridgeshire District Council and Cambridgeshire County Council resolved to grant outline planning permission, subject to the completion of a legal agreement.

Gallagher's proposal will deliver around 1,500 homes, a primary school, shops, community facilities, employment land and significant public open space including a water park. With a focus on sustainable development, the scheme is designed to create neighbourhoods with excellent pedestrian links, and Guided Busway routes to Cambridge and Huntingdon.

The resolution follows endorsement in July this year of a master plan for the entire town, which is being jointly promoted by Gallagher Estates and the Homes and Communities Agency (HCA). Northstowe will provide up to 10,000 new homes in total around a new town centre and aspires to be an exemplar development in terms of its design and environmental credentials.

Alan Joyner, Executive Director for Gallagher Estates said: "We are delighted that our planning application has been endorsed. We are committed to working with our partners and the local community and look forward to maintaining the momentum gained over the recent months to bring this first phase to fruition."

Terry Fuller, Executive Director at the HCA, said: "As well as being one of our top priorities, Northstowe has the full backing of national and local government. We're determined that this new town will serve the needs of existing and future residents in every respect, and have ensured that design quality is at the forefront of our proposals. Today's decision means we can look forward to a start on site in the second half of next year."

Laraine Southwood, Technical Director at Terence O'Rourke Ltd, the lead consultancy for the Phase 1 scheme, said: "The decision of the Northstowe Joint

Development Control Committee represents a significant step forward for this nationally important project. Delivering a new community with high environmental credentials is an exciting challenge and one which I'm confident will be a great success."

Over the coming months the Joint Promoters and the Councils will be looking to conclude the legal agreement and to secure the outline planning permission for Phase 1. Further detailed design work will then be undertaken before construction starts.

Council chiefs welcome A14 cash

Plans to improve the A14 to help bring forward the Northstowe development have been welcomed by Council chiefs. Cambridgeshire County Council has led a campaign with local MPs and partner councils to urge the Government to bring forward improvements for the congestion blighted road. On October 8th, Transport Secretary Patrick McLoughlin announced that various schemes in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough have been successful in gaining Pinch Point funding.

The £22 million package included improvements to the A14 between junctions 31 (Girton) and 32 (Histon): this would see reductions in congestion by widening the A14 between the junctions and installing three sign gantries across the width of the carriageway. The widening between junctions 31 and 32 would complement the planned works at Girton under the £20m allocation being made available as part of the A14 "Challenge" work, identified as a priority for the Cambridgeshire area. The improvements support the gateways of Felixstowe and Harwich ports as well as Northstowe Phase One development, which will create over 500 jobs and 1480 new homes. It also provides early improvements until the major improvements to the A14, announced by the Transport Secretary on 18 July 2012, come forward from 2018.

Cambridgeshire County Councillor Ian Bates said: "The A14 was completely off the agenda until we led a charge with local MPs and partner councils to get much needed improvements on this congestion blighted road. I am delighted that the Government has not only listened to us but has been working with us to bring forward improvements. It will help bring forward the Northstowe development which is needed to help boost the local economy, create jobs and provide affordable homes."

Councillor Ray Manning, South Cambridgeshire District Council's Leader, said: "I am pleased the Government is continuing to listen to Cambridgeshire's campaign for much needed improvements to the A14: this funding will certainly boost our economy and help deliver some of the much needed homes at Northstowe. For the whole town to be built a major upgrade is still needed and we are committed to working with our partners to keep the pressure up on the Government for delivery as early as possible."

High Street Being Dug Up

Anglian Water is planning to replace an existing sewer rising main from Milton Church Lane pumping station (whose access is actually in Ely Road at the north end of the high street) to the Cambridge Sewage Treatment Works. The work started on 29th October, and will be about sixteen weeks of work. There will be a break in the work between end of November and 7th January. During the work the high street will be subjected to lane closures and traffic lights. (N.B. these are the works which were originally planned to be starting on 10th September for completion before Christmas.)

Improvements to Service 9

Stagecoach have announced that from 4th November the service 9 is to be restored between Landbeach & Waterbeach and Ely for some services which previously terminated at Waterbeach. This should provide Milton with some extra services to Ely.

The services affected are (approximate times at village stops) the 09:30am and 12:30pm heading north. We're not sure the changes affect any southbound services.

Have you registered for the Connecting Cambridgeshire campaign to bring better broadband access for everyone across the county? Time is running out and we need as many people as possible to register before December 2012, when a supplier will be selected and planning for the big broadband rollout begins.

It only takes a minute to go online at www.connectingcambridgeshire.co.uk or fill in a Freepost reply form in the leaflet at your local library or council offices. All we need is your postcode, a landline phone number and whether you are a home or business user – we will only use this information for the campaign.

The more registrations we get, the more likely we are to get the investment needed to install better broadband connections for all (2Mbps minimum) with superfast speeds (25Mbps minimum) for at least 90% of premises by 2015.

Latest figures show that over 18,000 homes and businesses across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough have already registered, making our campaign one of the fastest growing in the country.

Support is being generated through the fantastic efforts of over 80 Broadband Champions, who are busy promoting the campaign through leaflets, posters, events, and community websites. Many parish councils and local councillors are also backing the campaign because good broadband connections are vital for our businesses and communities to thrive, particularly in rural areas.

Need practical help after a crisis, illness or hospital stay?

Care Network's Help at Home service can help!

Help at Home is a free service that offers practical help in the home if you have just come out of hospital or are experiencing an illness or crisis at home. We can help by: collecting your prescription; getting your shopping; arranging services such as meal delivery or calling in to see you are OK. The service is short term (up to three weeks) and provided by volunteers.

We also offer help with one-off tasks to help you remain independent at home, such as: changing a light bulb, taking curtains down for a wash or emptying the contents of high cupboards.

All our volunteers are trained, police checked and carry an identification badge.

How much does it cost?

The service is free for three weeks, after your illness or hospital stay. It is also free if you are referred for help by a health or social care professional. For one-off tasks which help you remain independent at home, we ask you to consider donating to our service (we are a charity no. 1120693).

How can I contact the service?

The service is open to all adults (over 18) in Cambridgeshire and anyone can ask for help. All you need to do is telephone your local Help at Home office: in South Cambridgeshire and Cambridge City, this is 01223 714433. Alternatively visit www.care-network.org.uk and click on Help at Home for more information.

Consider volunteering – it's good for you!

We are looking for volunteers in your area. Volunteering for Care Network's Help at Home is rewarding, and can fit around your other commitments – you just tell us your availability. Each case is up to 3 weeks and the volunteers usually visit between 3-7 times. We offer training and support and pay any out-of-pocket expenses. Do contact us on 01223 714433 if you would like more information on what's involved.

Care Network is a Cambridgeshire wide charity which helps older, isolated and vulnerable people living in Cambridgeshire to stay independent and maintain social contact with friends and the community.

We do this in 2 ways:

- By our direct services Information@GPs and Help at Home (Incorporating Welcome Home from Hospital) offering free short term practical help to people at home.
- By providing support for local groups and volunteers to design and set up new schemes. We will try to help with anything! Some examples are: lunch clubs, social car schemes, village help schemes, mobile wardens, and social groups. We have 98 of them in our county-wide network to date.

From the Desk of the Parish Council Chairman: Nov/Dec 2012

I would like to welcome Gail Wynne-Jones, who was co-opted onto the parish council at the November meeting. Gail, who is retired, has lived in Milton for eight years and is interested in the planning and management of the open spaces in the village.

Demolition has started on the former EDF site off Ely Road to make way for the general housing development — 'North Lodge Park' — by Bellway Homes Ltd. In past reports, I have explained how the parish had the option to accept either two football pitches with changing rooms and pavilion or a lump sum payment of £200,000 for recreation use in the village. At its November meeting, the parish council voted to take the pitches/pavilion option; the council felt that this was the best option for the village. Contractually, Bellway must provide two fully prepared pitches as well as a two-changing-room pavilion and car park before completion of the 65th dwelling on the new development.

There is a one-acre field by the allotments available for horse grazing. Anyone interested in renting it should contact the parish clerk (tel 861447; email clerk@miltonvillage.org.uk). Also notify the parish clerk if you see anyone spreading graffiti in the village; quite a lot of graffiti is appearing at the moment. It may be possible to review CCTV to identify the perpetrators.

The District and County Councils have made a few improvements I'd like to make sure you know about. If you are a South Cambs resident you can now arrange to pay your Council Tax directly from your monthly salary: call Debbie Lewis on 01954 713118. If you are a SCDC tenant you can pay your rent directly from your salary: call Brenda Robinson on 01954 713128. And if you are interested in your family history, Cambs County Council has now uploaded over two million records onto the internet. You can access them for free at www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/community/bmd/certificate.

The District Council has arranged for council homes to surveyed for asbestos. The survey work was contracted out to Savills, who were due to contact residents in July to arrange individual visits, to be completed by 12 October. However it appears that Savills' initial letters to tenants did not reach all recipients, though a strongly worded 'final warning' letter from the District

Council did arrive. If you have concerns, please contact Health & Environmental Services (tel 03450 450063; email env.health@scambs.gov.uk).

Finally, Cambs County Council is proposing a new railway station in the north of Cambridge. The station will be built in the area of Chesterton sidings, close to the Science Park, the Business Park and St John's Innovation Centre. The County Council want to know if you support the building of the new railway station and how you might use it. You can complete an questionnaire and find out more information and future updates at www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/scienceparkstation.

Wildlife Notes

Hopefully the mild autumn has allowed the housemartins which still were feeding young in their nests in mid-September to fledge and train their young for the long journey south. They clearly thought it worth trying a second, or possibly third, brood that late in the summer: were they spurred on by that lovely week we had at the beginning of September? That nest was in the City Centre tucked into one of the Tudor Roses in the Porters' Lodge at King's College. It's a very good place to watch the parents feed their young as the nest isn't very high off the ground. Hopefully everyone who is lucky enough to have a nest near them in Milton spotted these lovely birds.

Now we are much more autumnal, seeing the pied wagtails going in to roost at the Clinical School at Addenbrooke's reminds me to visit Milton Tesco at dusk: the pied wagtails who frequent the car park all day pile into the bushes near the petrol station as it gets dark. It's definitely worth timing your shopping trip and stopping to watch.

If you own a pair of binoculars, remember to take them along if you go for a walk in the Country Park. Over the summer, the aquatic birds seem mostly to be mallards, coots, moorhens, swans, greylag geese and cormorants with one or two great crested grebes. If we get a repeat of what came to overwinter there last year, look out for shovellers, teals, wigeons, pochards, tufted ducks, gadwalls and even little grebes, mostly on Dickerson's Pit. It's worth keeping your eye out for siskins too, especially near the War Memorial.


