

Milton for the Senior Generation

At a Milton Patient Participation Group meeting, we asked what our community had to provide in terms of life and variety for the senior generation in our community. When we retire, when the family moves away or we lose our loved partner, the world can appear a much more lonely place if we don't tap into the other people, communities and activities around us.

To find out more, I had a conversation with Sue Nunn. I learnt a bit more about the activities and events that are currently going on in Milton and those that we would like to have in the future, for which volunteers would be welcome.

The Church Lunch Club

Every Thursday in term time, there is a lunch club for those living alone in the church hall at All Saints Church in Milton. It's a great chance to get to chat over a meal and have a change of scenery.

The Good Companions

Friday is the social day for those living alone, meeting at Barnabas Court. The day starts mid-morning through to the afternoon, including coffee, lunch and a cup of tea.

Men's and Women's Breakfasts

If you are an early riser, the following may appeal: every term there are two breakfasts, one for men and one for women.

Other Interesting Groups

- A number of groups meet of an evening in the church hall:
- First Tuesday of the month: The Mothers Union is open to men and women of any age. Meeting at 7.30pm, they often have speakers on a range of topics.
- Second Tuesday: The Stitchers Group is a small group of people interested in stitching! They meet from 7.30 to 10 pm.
- Second Friday of the month: The Scrabble Club at 7.30pm. If you enjoy a game of Scrabble, they would be glad to welcome you.
- Third Tuesday of the month: The Women's Institute also has an active group in Milton, at 7.30pm.
- Third Friday: The Milton Ladies meet at 8pm. They also have visiting speakers on a range of topics.

Hats off to the ladies in Milton, who seem to have arranged a variety of activities!

Doing More

However in our conversation, Sue and I felt that this was still not enough.

For example, we used to have a vibrant Enterprise Club and the Over 60s. Here people could meet to play cards, Scrabble and pool. It would be great to revive this again within the village. We simply need someone to volunteer to take it on and get it started going.

And wouldn't it be great, if we actually had somewhere where we could have afternoon tea and cakes? This too would be a great socialising opportunity, whatever the age group. We do have a potential venue – we just need volunteers to make it happen.



From the Archives IO Years Ago: Dec 2003

Bridge Rolls into Position

At 12.02am on the morning of Saturday November 8th the Milton cycle/footbridge began to roll into position. The bridge weighing 130 tons and spanning 77 metres was picked up on 4 sets of wheels and rolled across the A14. The journey took about 30 - 40 minutes. Over 50 people stood on the viewing platform and watched the event - they had come from surrounding villages and one person had come from as far away as Milton Keynes.

Many people arrived later that night to find that the bridge had already moved -it was originally due to roll into position at around 2am. All during Saturday whilst the A14 was closed people continued to come to look at the bridge. For those who were there it was a once in a lifetime event. It was particularly sweet for Jane Coston who started campaigning for this bridge eleven years ago, as it happened on her birthday. Hazel Smith

I would like to take a few minutes to run through a few bits of advice to stop you having to call us at Christmas.

Our colleagues in traffic will clamp down on those caught driving over the drink-drive limit on our roads. Drivers caught drink or drug-driving will lose their licence or face a prison sentence.

If snow falls, windows will be iced-up and they can quickly become misty when heaters kick in. Make sure your windows are fully de-iced before setting off. It is also important to ensure lights and number plates are free from snow and ice.

Among the traditions of Christmas is often a rise in burglaries. Please follow these tips:

- 1. Close the curtains once it gets dark.
- 2. Keep doors and windows locked.
- 3. Hide any tempting gift-wrapped presents and remove presents from vehicles as soon as you can.

Connecting Cambridgeshire: Update

Connecting Cambridgeshire is on track to deliver superfast broadband to over 90% of homes and businesses across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough with better broadband of between 2Mbps and 24 Mbps for very nearly 100% of premises by the end of 2015.

The project is progressing apace and there is growing excitement as detailed planning for the first phases of the broadband roll-out takes shape - with the first cabinets due to go live with fibre by the end of 2013.

Connecting Cambridgeshire is planning to release as much information as possible about the 'where and when' of the roll-out with the launch of 'My Area' pages in September 2013 on www.connectingcambridgeshire.co.uk. This will help people to find out how their parish/area fits in to the multiple phases of the broadband roll-out plan and will be updated regularly as the programme progresses.

The Parish Council has been in contact with Anglian Water to complain about the odour from the sewage works. I would like to thank Jane Coston for all her work liaising with AWA to ensure action is being taken to resolve the situation. The public consultation on the A10/Landbeach Road junction held on September 23rd in the Community Centre was well attended. We look forward to finding out the preferred option and working with the County Council to make this junction safer for drivers, cyclists and pedestrians.

The Highways Agency gave a presentation to the council on the need for an A14 improvement scheme. Parish councillors had concerns about plans for the Milton junction as well as additional congestion during the improvement work. They also highlighted the need for improvements to the Girton junction. The proposed schedule for the works is a preferred route announcement at the end of 2013, a pre-application consultation in Spring 2014, with work to start late 2016. Wildlife Notes: A Walk in the Country Park

I note that despite all this wind, there still seem to be many leaves on the trees. I assume it's the lack of frosts; I've certainly not noticed one yet. I've just done a full circumnavigation of the Park, so here are my observations. Tompkins Mead is lovely and wet as it should be. I was transfixed by a gang of long tailed tits which were around me as I stood silently, almost close enough for me to touch them. A robin was singing beautifully, an observation repeated many times as I wandered around. It may be a beautiful song, but it's saying "get off my land" as robins are fiercely territorial.

Once I got around the lakes, the main occupants of Todd's Pit seemed to be mallards, swans, coots and various gulls which I'm not expert enough to identify. Dickerson's Pit seemed to have a more varied population. The large number of gadwall, tufted ducks and handful of shovelers were there on both occasions and maybe are settling in for the winter. I didn't see the pochards I saw two weeks ago, so perhaps they've moved on somewhere else. I was thinking the same of the half-dozen or so wigeon I saw last time, until I spotted them on the very far eastern shore. I'm pretty sure I saw a couple of little grebes and the resident great crested grebe now appears to be in winter plumage. I note that last March, most of the wigeon and pochard were actually on Todd's so it's always worth walking round both pits.

The six cygnets on Dickerson's are now the same size as their parents but mostly brown, and still making very "childlike" noises. They came up to me as I looked at them from one of the anglers' swims. I think they thought I had food, as most of the other visitors to the Park seemed to have a bag of excess bread. Don't forget that the Visitor Centre sells bags of duck food. This is much better for them than bread, which can be harmful to ducks and the leftover crumbs breed algae and diseases.
