

The park is run by registered charity Cambridge Sport Lakes Trust, and receives no external funding, so this event is an important part of the calendar,



Many people have been asking and commenting on the lovely new welcome sculpture at the entrance to the country park.



The sculpture was gifted to the park by Peter Garside (centre) as a memorial to his late wife, Pauline. Peter and Pauline walked their dogs in the park regularly for many years, finding it especially helpful as a way of enjoying the outdoors when Pauline was suffering from Alzheimer's disease. Pauline even tried cycling for the first time in 50 years in the park with inclusive cycling project You Can Bike Too! Pauline loved the park and Peter felt it would be a fitting tribute to add something really special to the entrance, welcoming visitors as they arrive.

Rowan Humberstone is a small Cambridge charity and arts centre working with people with learning disabilities

by sharing skills and giving meaningful opportunities through accessing the arts. Rowan's student artists, Ash and Francis (pictured with Mr Garside above) worked on the chosen design. The design is carved from oak and depicts some of the wildlife Pauline enjoyed seeing in the park, including a swan and coot by lily pads carved on the front of the design and a beautiful dragonfly on the back.

We think this is a really special addition to the park and would like to thank Peter for this donation and Rowan for their care in creating and installing this piece. We hope our visitors will enjoy it for many years to come!

#### **Parliamentary Boundaries**

MVV Issue 125 (Nov '16) had details of the proposed changes to the parliamentary constituency boundaries, which would have moved Milton out of South East Cambridgeshire and into the Cambridge constituency. The final proposals have now been published, and Milton will be staying in the South East Cambridgshire constituency.

According to the report, many comments were received about Milton, both supporting and opposing the move. In the end, the decision to keep Milton in South East Cambridgeshire was swayed by the desire not to split local authority areas (i.e. South Cambridge District Council) across parliamentary constituency boundaries.

However, the commissioners say that they "welcome further comments about this issue, provided it does not repeat representations already received."

#### 7,600 Homes Proposed on Sewage Works Site

The Cambridgeshire & Peterborough combined authority have submitted a £200m bid to the government's DCLG Housing Infrastructure Fund to redevelop a 48-hectare site which includes the Anglian Water Wastewater Recycling facility. The site straddles both Milton parish and Cambridge City.

The bid will be assessed this month, with the final decision announced in Summer 2018.

The plans include up to 7,600 homes, located near the new Cambridge North railway station, and relocation of the Wastewater Recycling Facility.

# The College Big Build gets the go-ahead



## Fen Road Housing Proposal

Kingswater Lindum have proposed a "100% affordable" housing development of 36 dwellings on Fen Road: 24 units affordable rent and 12 shared ownership. The landscaping of the development will be maintained by Cross Keys Homes and will be an open plan design. The only loss of vegetation will be to clear the way for the new access road. Each property will be allocated car parking spaces with the possibility of an extra 60 cars using Fen Road.



The land in question is the first field on the left down Fen Road, which has the woods and lake of Milton Hall on the far side of it. There are houses along most of the right side of Fen Road at this point and it's also right on the edge of the flood plain (which runs along the 5m contour). All of this field is currently Green Belt.

#### Blue Bins — No More Caddies!

Council waste bosses have confirmed there will be no need for South Cambridgeshire residents to use paper caddies from mid-December, in a move to simplify the recycling process.

From 11 December 2017, residents should place used paper directly into their blue wheelie bins for recycling.

The withdrawal of caddies also means fewer waste collection vehicles will in future be needed, helping save taxpayers around £670,000 during the next seven years compared to the existing system.



#### Milton MU

One of our objectives is to help those whose family life has met with adversity. We were delighted in October to present Milton Primary School with a bereavement box that included books for staff members and parents to use with children when they are facing loss. This might be the death of a relation or friend, the break up of the family home or even moving away and changing schools. The box also included a couple of teddy bears (one sporting the MU logo) and resources to support staff members.





Earlier this year we sent some money to help Mothers' Union

members in Rwanda. A local member who had visited told us about the need for pigs. Our gift resulted in four new pigs for them. The email of thanks that we received along with some photographs shows just how transformational they were for the life of the local community. Recently we have sent £200 to the diocese to be donated overseas. Mothers' Union has a presence in 83 countries. Facilitators are trained to run literacy and numeracy programmes, parenting classes and more, enabling local members to help others in their communities.

Nearer to home we will participate in 16 Days of Activism against gender-based violence, focusing on the issue of stigma, where society responds negatively to gender-based violence or holds victims to be culpable. MU members within the diocese of Ely will be holding a silent vigil and banner witness at Ely Cathedral on 1st December from 11am to noon. In Milton we are ending the year with an early Christmas lunch on 5th December at noon in the church hall. We will also take part in the annual "wave of prayer" when members worldwide pray for each other. We will be remembering members in Zambia, Rwanda, Nigeria and India. #### Wildlife Notes

My copy date for the Village View is always the first day of month it drops through your door, so it's possible that the weather has changed by the time you read this. There are still masses of leaves on the trees currently. Although it's been very windy at times, we've only had one attempt at a proper frost which is what really loosens the leaves. So I predict anyone who can normally see fireworks through bare trees from their garden or a window may have been disappointed this year.

There are three British mammals which hibernate over winter, and in Milton, two are resident, the hedgehog and bat. After not seeing hedgehogs during August or much of September, they reappeared and the feeding station is now busy most evenings, with at least two different individuals visiting. Similarly, I've still been seeing bats flying at dusk, both in the village and above the river. So we now seem to have had mild autumnal weather since early August. Looking back at previous columns, I note that this autumn is different from two years ago, when I noted both hedgehogs and bats had seemingly disappeared at least a week or two before the end of October.

At least one species that I think counts as a winter migrant to Milton is starting to come back. I'd not seen a little grebe for several months, but there were two bobbing around on the river at the end of Fen Road on that first really cold morning after the clocks changed. A wander around the Country Park the next day was a very quiet affair. There were many tufted ducks on both Todd's and Dickerson's pits, and I spotted a little grebe on Todd's near the Visitor Centre. There is a great crested grebe in very fine winter plumage on Dickerson's and I was lucky enough to see a kingfisher briefly. There are some gadwall, but not as many as I'd expect by the new year. It was good to hear both a great spotted woodpecker and the yaffle, almost like a laugh, of a green woodpecker. One thing I do love in these early dusks is the chip-chipping of the blackbirds just after sunset. Maybe that's my consolation for the lack of light in the evenings?

#### Behind the Scenes

The black squirrel continues to be seen in Milton. I originally reported its presence in the Village View (Issue no. 68, June 2005). Recently in the Village View (Issue no. 129, September 2017), an excellent photograph of a black squirrel taken by Tony Onyett appears; and our daughter has seen a black squirrel in Willow Crescent. This autumn, a



lighter shade of black squirrel appeared in our garden in Fen Road (*left*) suggesting a cross between a black and grey squirrel which can occur as they are the same species.

Research at Anglia Ruskin University on the black squirrel, found mainly in Bedfordshire, Hertfordshire and Cambridgeshire has shown that black squirrels have a piece of gene missing controlling pigment. If both parents have the gene you get full black offspring, if only one parent has

the gene a more grey – black animal arises. Black squirrels migrated from Hertfordshire to Cambridgeshire in the 1990s, becoming dominant in Girton. The mutated gene has travelled 50 miles in 100 years (after arriving from America) – half a mile a year. How much further will the animal migrate?
