With the imminent closure of Waterbeach Barracks the last plane has recently left the airfield. However, this was not a conventional departure via the runway but by road on a low loader transporter. The Hawker Hunter F2 (WN904) had been the airfield's gate guardian for many years but on August 2nd moved to its new home at Sywell Aviation Museum in Northamptonshire.

Waterbeach airfield has been an integral part of the local community for many decades and was home to the very rare radial-engined Avro Lancaster mark IIs of 514 squadron during WW2. More recently it has been home to 39 Engineer Regiment. The airfield is due to close in March 2013.

EDF Site — Proposed Development



Bellway Homes Ltd. have put in a planning application for a proposed development on the former EDF depot and training centre, on Ely Road.

You may remember that the previous planning application for the site was for a retirement village. By contrast, the new proposal is for general housing (89 dwellings), with a mix of sizes and style of houses and flats.

The application also includes a new playground area and sports pitches, as well as restoring and reopening the area around North Lodge.

Winter is Coming, So will the Flu

So why not come to the surgery and let us help to protect you?

Milton Surgery flu campaign starts end of September 2012. Please ring the surgery during September to make an appointment for your flu vaccination with the nurse.

Most people who get flu recover after a week or two, but some develop life threatening complications such as pneumonia, nerve or brain damage.

You are more likely to be at risk of complications of flu if you are in one of the 'at risk' groups and your body is already weakened.

Flu vaccinations are especially important if:

- \Rightarrow You are aged 65 or older
- ⇒ You have had a stroke or TIA (mini stroke)
- ⇒ You have reduced immunity
- ⇒ You are the main carer for an elderly or disabled person
- \Rightarrow You have diabetes
- **⇒** You have chronic heart disease
- ⇒ You have chronic kidney, liver or lung disease
 - > You are pregnant

If you fall into any of these 'at risk' categories, please contact the surgery on 420511 to make an appointment for the **Flu Jab.** A flu vaccination does **not** cause flu.



New Fire Service Training Facility on Milton Industrial Park

CAMBRIDGESHIRE Fire and Rescue Service's new training facility was officially opened on August 31st by Chief Fire Officer Graham Stagg and Chairman of the Fire Authority Fred Brown. Guests were able to see some of the different training scenarios firefighters would be practising on the site.

The facility boasts a large training building which can be altered to simulate fires in a number of different properties including warehouses, houses and shops. The house can be filled with artificial smoke to make visibility

poor, as it would be with a real fire.

The drill tower allows for working at height training and within the compound there is plenty of space for other skills training, such as road traffic collision work, animal rescues and ladder work.

Sewer Replacement — Roadworks

Anglian Water is replacing an existing sewer rising main from Milton Church Lane pumping station to Cambridge Sewage Treatment Works. The existing 1500m long 150mm PVC main is being replaced with 180mm PE main by mainly pipe bursting with open cut in the field near A14.

The work started on the 10th September and will finish around 9th December. During the construction, the road (Ely Road, Cambridge Road, High Street, Cowley Road) is under lane closure 2 way traffic lights. The work is starting from the Milton Church Lane Pumping Station and continuing to Ely Road, High Street, Cambridge Road, Cowley Road, then to the Cambridge Sewage Treatment Works.

Message from your PCSO

Summer 2012 is over now and fortunately, Crime and ASB-wise, it has been reasonably quiet. The summer events have hopefully inspired us all, and many of us may have decided to do more cycling. Unfortunately the issue of cycle theft remains a concern throughout Cambridgeshire. If you or a member of your family have a cycle please take note of the following advice

Register it: Register model, make and frame number to increase your chance of getting it back if it's stolen. You can do this at www.immobilise.com. Frame numbers can usually be found: near the handlebars, below the seat post, by or underneath the pedals, or towards the back wheel.

Security mark it: Use an ACPO-approved marking scheme. Make sure the security mark:

- Is clearly visible, highlighting that the cycle is security coded
- Is secure and difficult for a thief to remove
- Includes a registration log book, proving ownership

Buy a lock: Or even two. Expect to pay at least £40 for a decent lock. Locking your cycle securely:

- Lock 'tight' so that your cycle is hard to move around when parked
- Lock both wheels and the frame to a cycle stand or other immoveable object
- Secure your lock so it does not touch the ground: a lock lying on the pavement can be easily sledge-hammered

Insure it: Add a standard cycle to your home contents insurance, ensuring it is covered for theft outside of your home. More valuable cycles should be insured separately.

Additional security measures

- Park your cycle where it can be seen but not in the same place every day
- Make sure the locks catch the cycle frame as well as both wheels and the post
- Face the lock to the ground (but not resting on it) so it can't easily be turned upwards for picking
- Fill the D part of a lock with as much of the cycle as possible to reduce the chance of it being smashed open
- Take removable items with you, for example lights, pump

From the Desk of the Parish Council Chairman: September 2012

The new fitness equipment on the Sycamores Rec was installed in June – and just in time for the Olympics! I encourage residents to make use of the new equipment as well as all the other play areas in the village. On the issue of recreation space, the parish council will be called upon to make a decision about the playing fields on the new general housing development on the former EDF site off Ely Road. Bellway Homes Ltd has purchased the site and intends to start building this Autumn. The parish has an option of accepting either two football pitches with changing rooms and pavilion or a lump sum of £200,000 to be used for recreation in the village. The parish council continues to consult with village sports clubs on this issue.





We have been concerned for some time about a traffic problem by the Milton Park & Ride site. Your parish councillors met with the County Council's Area Traffic Manager to discuss how to alleviate traffic missing the turning at the P&R site, then turning north along the A10 and doing a U-turn at Rectory Farm or the Humphries Way junction. Signage is the key to stop traffic taking the wrong route and needing to turn round. As a result of the meeting, an additional sign showing 'All Routes A14' will be added at the exit of the P&R car park and 'All Routes A14' will be added to existing signs.

A new village Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator is being sought to liaise with the various street-coordinators. Please see the article from Polly Wilderspin in this issue. There is also still a vacancy on the parish council. I urge anyone interested to contact the Clerk for more information (telephone 861447 or email

Wildlife Notes

It seems a crying shame that Summer is practically over, given that we've barely had one! I think the swifts and terns agreed, as I've not seen any since the beginning of August. As I write this near the end of August, there still seem to be plenty of house martins around both in the village and further afield. Cycling along the river the Sunday before Bank Holiday, I noticed a lot of swallows flying over the river. Passing under the A14 bridge, I noted some were flying up into the pipe channel under the bridge and saw a nest with noisy young that two adults were incessantly taking insects to. Hopefully the warm weather will last into September/October to allow the young swallows, probably a second brood, to fledge and fatten up for their long journey to Southern Africa.

If you're interested in the fate of other summer birds, the BTO have tagged some cuckoos again this year, some from Norfolk but also Scottish and Welsh ones. The website is www.bto.org/cuckoos. Other birds of note have been two excellent sightings of a barn owl in the evening on Milton Fen, and being woken up by a very loud tawny owl the other night!

The hedgehogs are still visiting our feeding station, which is very pleasing. We've had three different individuals, all of whom look as if they're already a healthy weight to hibernate, but snuffling around our garden eating our slugs, snails, worms and beetles as well as the top-up dry cat food we put out hopefully will help them stay healthy through the Autumn until they decide to hibernate. We've got plenty of piles of vegetation under shrubs as well as a couple of commercial "hedgehog houses" given to us as presents, so we can hope to be host to these prickly beasts. A reminder, as the nights draw in, for drivers to be careful, not only for the sake of hedgehogs, but for all residents of the village, especially children and the elderly.
