

Swifts in Milton

About 87,000 pairs of swifts come to the UK in summer from Africa to breed — down 50% in 20 years.

Around 10 pairs nested at my house this summer. I got my first pair of swifts in 2012, yet they would fly around the area before that. Newer houses tend to lack any suitable nest-places - perhaps this is the cause of the alarming decline in swift numbers. There are swift nest-boxes on the back of a house in Goding Way - you can just about see them by looking from Fen Rd. near the 'blue tree house'. I've also seen them get under the fascia board / bargeboard at the gable end of the EACH offices in High Street nearest the Lion & Lamb.



Many people - on mention of swifts - say "We have those" or "They make a mess" - it soon becomes evident that they are talking about House Martins. If it makes a mud-cup under

eaves, it's a house martin. If it nests on ledges in barns / porches / garages / under bridges, then it's probably a Swallow. Nothing wrong with either of those - I'd welcome house martins at my house - but they're not swifts. You could have swifts, and hardly know - they disappear into any small holes, make a very minimal nest inside near the entrance, and don't make any mess at all

What you can't help but notice is that at certain times of day, groups of them fly around nest-colonies making their 'screaming' calls. As mentioned on Springwatch, they might be the world's fastest bird in level flight - 70 mph maybe? One gets the impression that they show off their flying ability just 'because they can...'.



Ofo bike area changes

At the beginning of August, ofo announced two important changes to how they operate, which could be costly for Milton residents!.

The first change is that the operating area in and around Cambridge is reduced: so that the only part of Milton covered is Tesco.

The second change is that now all bikes parked outside of the operating area will *trigger a £10 service fee*. This will be automatically applied as soon as a bike is parked and locked outside of the zone. Bikes can still be ridden outside the geofence but trips must be completed inside.

What If? Plan

The What If? Plan is a free service funded by Cambridgeshire County Council to look after adults with care needs during an emergency involving their family carer. If the person you look after lives in Cambridgeshire you can register your What If? Plan with us and apply for an Emergency Card and key fob.

A Lucky Fish!

Another hot summer with reservoirs. ponds and rivers running dry; this year is similar to 1976. That year, my brother and I walked into the land off Fen Road where today is an entrance to the Country Park. Soon we came across a small gravel pit on the left, but with only a bathful of water present and a floundering medium size tench! Fortunately, we found an old bucket nearby and transferred the fish into the Deep Pool close by: the site of the small gravel pit was never restored and is now rough ground in the trees.

Wildlife Notes

I think I said in the last Village View that spring seemed rather late. From my rather unscientific jottings, I'd say I first saw significant numbers of housemartins nearer the end of May than April, and some people who regularly have them nesting in their buildings have commented that they just never came this summer. When I was over in the Humphries Way area of the village in early August, there were some, but possibly not as many as other years. Elsewhere, the yellowhammer still seems to be hanging on in the Fen Road, although whether his singing leads to a mate and a nest, I don't know. I see deer sometimes down there. In mid-July there was an adult with a youngster in the field just before the railway, which rather held up my commute as I stopped to look at them.

There were a couple of Country Park highlights. In early June I heard a cuckoo calling a couple of days running; once in the very early morning, and the following day at dusk. In late May I took a circuitous walk from dropping my car off at the garage which turned out rather well when I saw three kingfishers simultaneously from the jetty on Dickersons pit. I'm sure I could hear another one from a different direction too. More amusingly, I managed to corner a squirrel at the end of the jetty, and then saw a coot and moorhen fighting each other. The moorhen won.

It's wonderful how many swifts there are over Milton now. The efforts of the local swift enthusiasts have really paid off, making summer days and evenings in the garden a pleasure, with the twittering of the housemartins combined with the fast flight and screaming of the swifts above the garden.

The hedgehog feeding station has been busy most of the summer. I suspect worms were in very short supply as it was so dry, hence really enthusiastic taking of the hedgehog food by the blackbirds too. Birds were also drinking out of the hedgehog water bowl, as there were no puddles and the pond was totally dry. There was less activity in late August probably as we'd had enough rain that there was some decent natural food available. Do remember when driving to moderate your speed so you can stop if you spot one crossing the road as the evenings draw in.

Scheduled Ancient Monuments

Two fields, Hill Close and Long Meadow north of Fen Road, have been preserved by Historic England as Scheduled Ancient Monuments prohibiting any future housing or industrial development here. The Secretary of State decided to add the fields to the Schedule of Monuments in June 2018.

Crop marks, geophysics, finds of pottery, glass and coins showed that a typical Romano-British farmstead settlement had been present in Long Meadow. The finds in Hill Close showed that this field is uniquely a multi-period site from the prehistoric to Roman in the east, to medieval and Saxon in the west, the latter where the proposed housing development was to occur.

The Parish Council minutes dated 23 May 1961 report that the developers wanted to call the road North Close. The PC recommended Lyndhurst Close. It has always been my understanding that this was a simple spelling mistake. Lynhurst Cottages and Farm were there long before Lyndhurst Close. *Jim Daniels*
