Ekisa News and Events

Many Milton residents will know of Ekisa – a children's home and school for children with special needs in Uganda, which was co-founded by Miltonite Emily Henderson. Ekisa UK raised £22,440 during 2018 to support Ekisa's day-to day activities, including the Community Care Programme, which currently works alongside 90 children and their families, with social workers, therapists and nurses moving families from despair and isolation to hope and inclusion.

The social workers have continued to work tirelessly to find permanent homes for the 22 children in the Residential Care Programme through resettlement, kinship care, foster care or adoption: Timothy has been placed into a foster family and Debra's adoption and British citizenship have been finalised, which many of us thought would be impossible given the "Hostile Environment" at the Home Office, but God's Love conquers all!

I also want to pay tribute to the children of All Saints Milton, who welcomed Debra and organised several fundraising events during the year. I am totally proud of them.

Once again, a big thank you to all who have supported us, especially those who have donated laptops following our recent appeal,

and for the many businesses in Milton who have supported us by donating raffle prizes.

Beaches Community Car Service (BCCS)

BCCS is a volunteer driver scheme to provide transport to medical (given priority) and social appointments for those who have difficulties using or accessing public transport because of age and/or mobility, or live where public transport is limited. The scheme covers Waterbeach, Landbeach, Milton, Chittering, and Horningsea. We have a number of regular/occasional clients in Milton. Unfortunately, the two drivers recruited through this publication last year have had to retire due to ill health, and we do not want to have to have to say no to our clients, as they really do rely on the service.

This leaves a big gap in our coverage of Milton, and we would be interested in hearing from any driver who has a few hours to spare, and would be interested in joining the scheme. Drivers can do as little or as much as they wish, and will be compensated at the rate of 45p per mile (this is not taxable). The scheme is under the auspices of Cambridgeshire County Council and Care Network.

New Police Station

The Police and Crime Commissioner, Jason Ablewhite, has proposed building a new police station just south of the Milton Park and Ride site.

He says: "The number of custody cells need increasing so that officers don't spend hours transferring detainees to Peterborough, when the cells in Parkside become full.

"I want to reassure people that there will definitely be a police service in the centre of Cambridge City." We are also in need of coordinators, who use the scheme's mobile phone, and take turns to liaise with clients and drivers. This involves a few hours each week for two weeks, at approximately two-monthly intervals.

Chairman's report – Milton Parish Council

Councillors In May we welcomed to Alex Markham as a new Councillor, but there are still vacancies. More information is on the web <u>www.miltonvillage.org.uk/how-to-become-a-parish-councillor</u>.



Play Areas (*left*) New equipment was installed on Froment Way including a wheelchair-accessible roundabout. Other play equipment has been repaired or repainted and new bark added. Protruding roots were removed from The Rowans area. The Clerk is supporting the Milton Community Centre (MCC) with grant applications and planning for new equipment for the Sycamores.

The play areas are frequently inspected. We also arrange for biannual RoSPA safety inspections. If you see issues needing attention please notify the Parish Clerk, except for Coles Road, Sycamores, and North

Lodge Park recreation grounds which should be reported to the MCC Manager.

Tomkins Mead Minor repairs were carried out to the boardwalk.

Parish Pump The fallen bushes around the pump will be cut back now that the nesting season has finished.

War Memorial Area (*right*) Roots were removed from around the two memorial benches and the area seeded. The Golden Jubilee tree is showing good growth where the intruding bushes and ivy were removed.

Grant funding The crossing area over the High Street in front of the EACH office will be repaired with funds from the A14 Legacy fund following a successful grant application.

Travellers Travellers set up camp with caravans and other vehicles on the Coles



Road Recreation Ground. Arrangements were immediately made for them to be removed. We are grateful to South Cambs for their quick response to inspect the site and complete a litter pick.

Combined District Councillors Report (June 2019)

Climate Change Following a resolution to aim for zero carbon by 2050, South Cambs has sponsored a symposium in Cambridge on Climate Change Research and Action which Hazel attended. 80% of the houses we'll be living in in 2050 are already built, so improving the existing housing stock has to be a priority, and South Cambs is already reviewing its maintenance plans with this in mind. One of the easiest ways we can make a difference is to eat less meat and dairy products. We have to increase recycling rates and generate as much renewable energy as possible. We also need to plant more trees.

Universal Credit We had a useful meeting on Universal Credit with Heidi Allen, who was sitting on a Select Committee reviewing the implementation of UC. The website <u>entitledto.co.uk</u> has a very useful calculator: once you've applied for UC there is no turning back even if you realise you've made a mistake and will be worse off.

Waterbeach Internal Drainage Board Hazel and Anna attend their meeting – it was interesting to hear the IDB view of the continuing dry weather, as their remit includes providing water for irrigation when needed.

21st Century Town Centre Planning At Cambourne we learnt from Bill Grimsey what we should be aiming to provide to make for a successful town centre, in the age of internet shopping, drone delivery and low-carbon living. He is retired and spends his time advising councils with failing town centres how to regenerate them. Some of the Waterbeach developers were at the meeting to hear his opinions.

At the end of the symposium we talked about the principle of making a library the heart of a community. During 2019 the County Council has been working with an organisation called Civic who are designing 'Libraries for the future' as the key element in any community hub. Northstowe is to be used as a pilot for this concept and Anna asked that Waterbeach New Town should be involved too, incorporating a library facility into Phase 1.

Waterbeach New Town Urban and Civic's outline planning application for up to 6,500 dwellings was approved by SCDC's planning committee on 13th May by 8 votes to 3. The application covers the Western half of the proposed new town site with the first primary access from the A10 at the Cambridge Research Park roundabout.

Wildlife Notes

I'm glad to see Milton has made a good contribution to my swifts sightings again this summer. Although I see quite a few elsewhere on my commute through the city, I regularly see and hear them in the region north of the Country Park and over the High Street and Cambridge Road at the northern end. My last sighting of them was in fact in Milton, above Old School Lane on 1st August.

As I write this in early September, the swallows are still flying above the river, although I'm sure this is in preparation for departure south soon. There still seem to be plenty of housemartins around too. I've seen and heard the yellowhammer on the Fen Road regularly all summer; a cheering experience when on the way to work!

After the predation of two nests in our garden, there must have been some success somewhere else. We've had a juvenile robin and seen young great tits being fed by their parents and have seen juvenile blackbirds. Although we had a flurry of hedgehog activity in May and June, we've not seen one since the very beginning of July, despite putting out food and water regularly. Something very odd is going on but I'm mystified as to what it is. Sadly one of our sightings ended badly. We saw one on the feeding station camera that looked as if it had a broken leg. We found a vet that will look at wildlife and they gave me the bad news that the poor thing had a broken pelvis so couldn't be saved. It was very strange as there were no external injuries suggestive of being hit by a car or being bitten by a dog. The receptionist said it was possible that "kids" could have used it as a football; I hope nothing like that ever has happened in Milton.

We have seen a grass snake at least twice in the garden which is good news; as they are very shy it's possible that it's around more regularly but unseen. And it's pleasing that in the last few weeks I'm regularly hearing a very noisy owl in the Country Park. Hopefully this means that there is a healthy ecosystem to support a top predator like that and somewhere it can nest so we can have a population of owls in Milton.
